

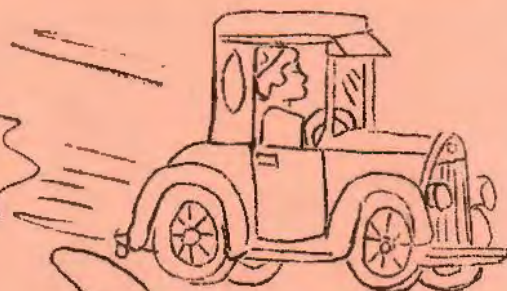

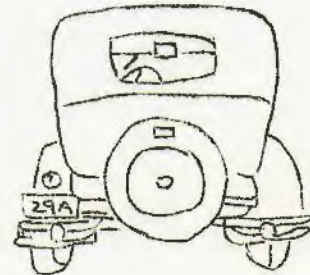

"TECH TIPS"
by Jim Buford

To install a muffler without any assistance and to insure against possible leaks, place a jack under the exhaust pipe, just in front of the muffler. The flange of the exhaust pipe will center itself and will eliminate the possibility of any leaks. It also allows the use of both hands to tighten the clamps.

If a leak occurs in the gasoline tank, it is not necessary to drain the tank to repair or repack the valve. Screw on the radiator cap in place of the gas cap on the filler hole opening. The vacuum will have a tendency to hold the fuel in the tank, and if you work fast removing the valve and installing a plug, very little gasoline will be lost.

To protect your Model A lamps' wiring, add a 14 amp fuse in series. Insert the fuse holder from wiring harness to cut-out terminal.
