TECH TIPS by Jim Marsh

STEERING PROBLEMS

This month's article is directed to the Model A with steering or front end problems. Listed below, you will find some of the common problems and cures.

SHIMEY AT LOW SPEED: Too much easter or a twisted exle.

SHIMEY AT HIGH SPEED: Eccentric or unbalanced wheels; low or unequal tire pressure.

HARD TURNING: Too much caster; tight spindle assembly; low or unequal tire pressure.

WANDER OR WEAVE: Too little caster; tight steering assembly or gear; wheels loose on hub spindles.

SCUFFED TIRES: Wrong pitch or toe-in; swung front or rear end; bent spindle; bent or twisted axle.

WORN SHOULDERS ON TIRE TREAD: Wrong pitch; bent spindle; bent axle.

Following the gymkhana, the food was brought on and it was very good. A few Orange Coutians were seen going for "second


