

TECHNICAL TIPS by Jim Marsh


HELPFUL HINTS IN RESTORING THE MODEL A CHASSIS

When painting the chassis and undercarrige parts, have all parts dipped or sandblasted to remove all rust, paint and grease. Then prime them within 12 hours (clean parts rust quick) and paint them with a good grade black automotive enamel. Don't use cheap stuff. Enamel should be used because it doesn't get as hard as lacquer and therefore won't chip as readily.

Havo all hardware (nuts, bolts, washers, pins, and springs) cad plated. Most plating houses will barrel plate that stuff for about 25¢ per pound. Set all springs aside and have them heat treated after plating. This will cost extra. When reassembling, use new cotter pins throughout. Apply a small dab of grease to all moving parts.




Matrix identifies the pretty, black, patent leather, one-strap shoe called Crestwell, with Cuban heel and a silverized button for the strap.

Donna poddicord is in the hospital, following surgery. Take care of your self, Donna. Hope to see you up and about real soon.






