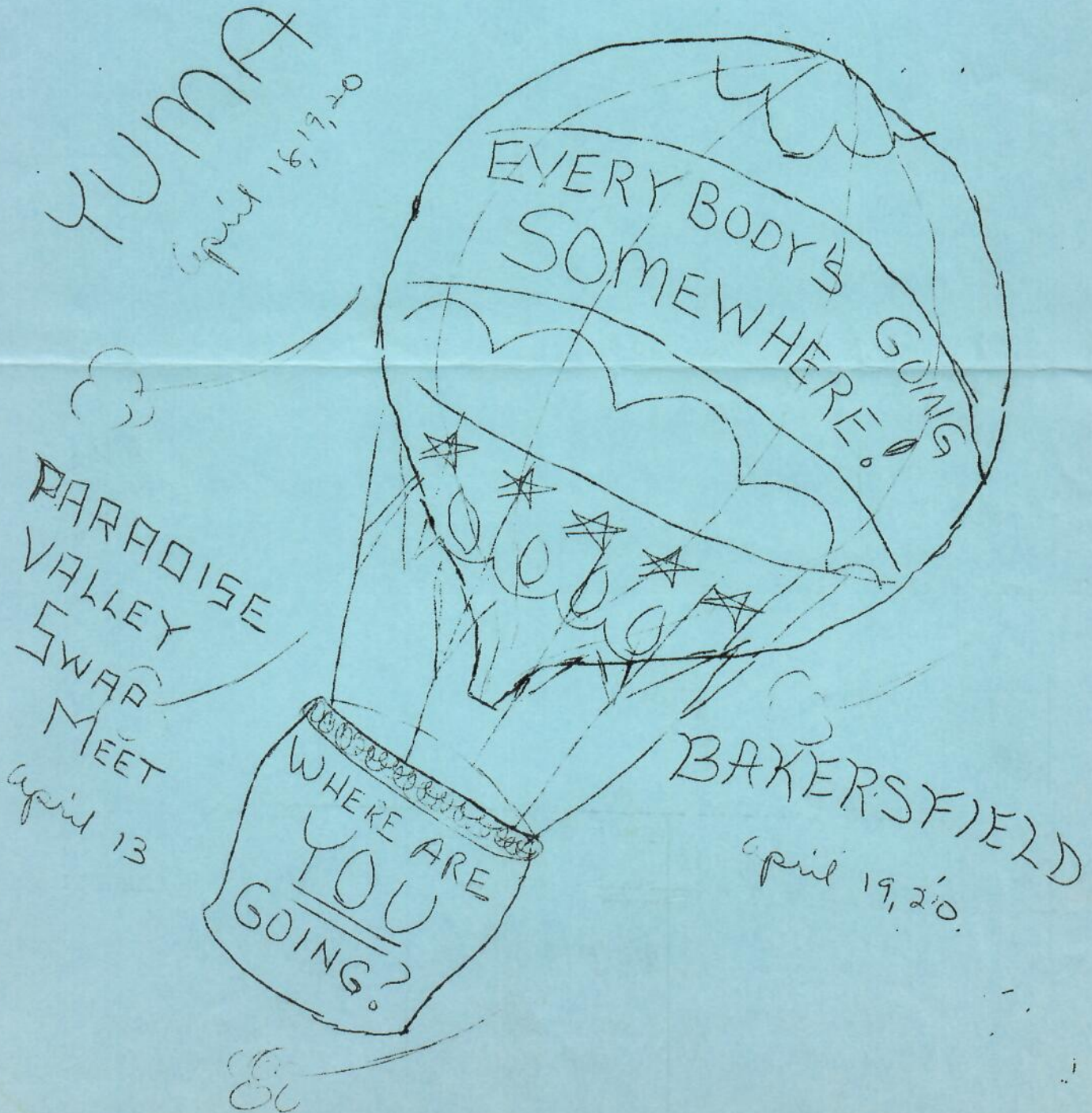

Timely Tips for Spring

1. After car has been used little for the winter months, now is a good time to remove horn cover and place a few drops of light oil on each end of the armature shaft.
2. Check the drain hole in flywheel housing to see if it is unclogged. There is supposed to be a colter pen in drain hole, it is no mistake .
3. Another area overlooked is the lubricating of the clutch release bearing, don't forget this.
4. Brakes should be looked after now, prior to first spring tours. All brakes fade so gradual we seldom notice a change until we need them in an emergency.
5. Hood clips can be oiled now, one drop of light oil on each.
6. after can has not been used much, the battery should be checked, cleaning terminals, adding water, etc. Look for frayed or dangerous cables.
7. Another safty feature you can utilize is the use of fuses in electrical system. Depending on how original you want to keep car, those can be hidden under dash and still offer protection. After seeing all the wiring burn on a car due to a short, the decision is yours to make on the use of fuses.

Heres a hot day driving tip: To secure mazimum ventilation in front soat of car, windshield should not be oponed more than 1 1/2" measured from windshield opening in dash. I have tated it and it really works.
