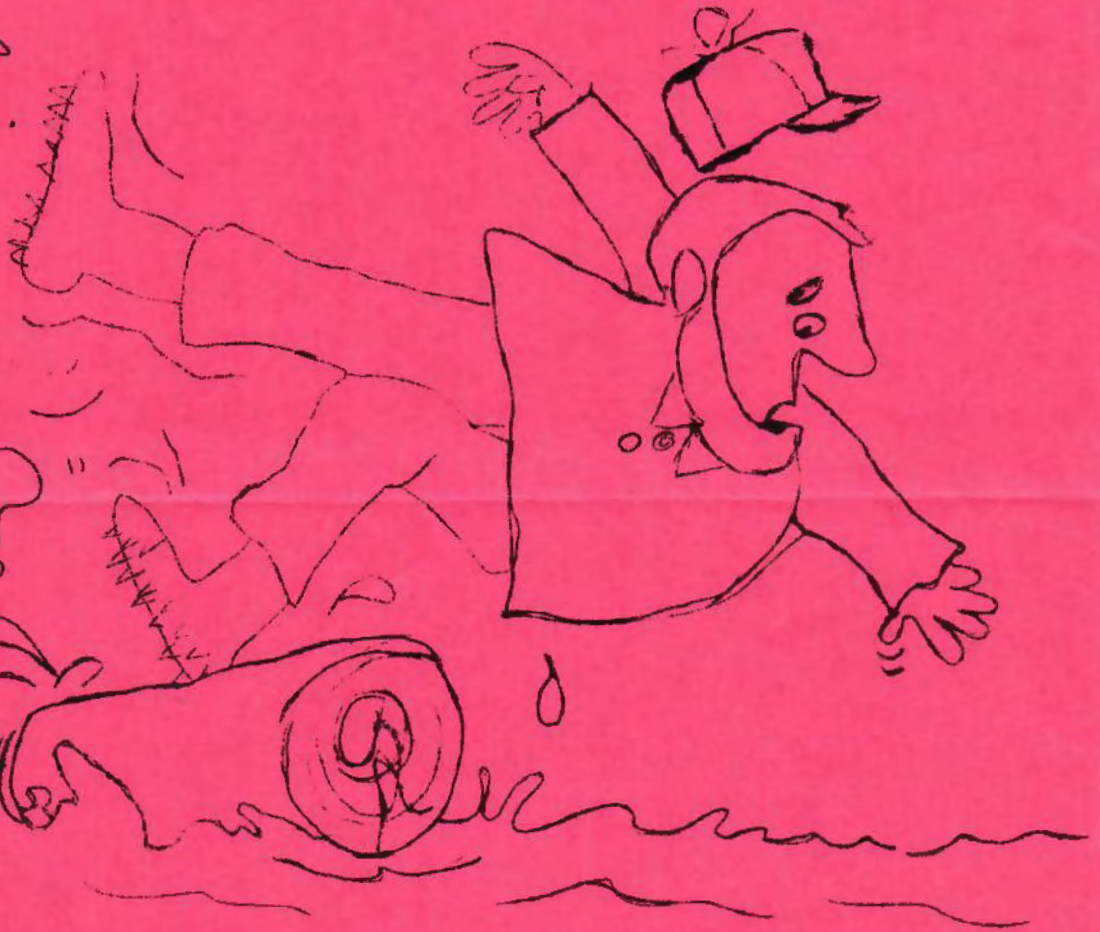

It was brought up that anyone joining the club in Oct. will get Nov. and Dec. free. Their dues will be paid for the following year.

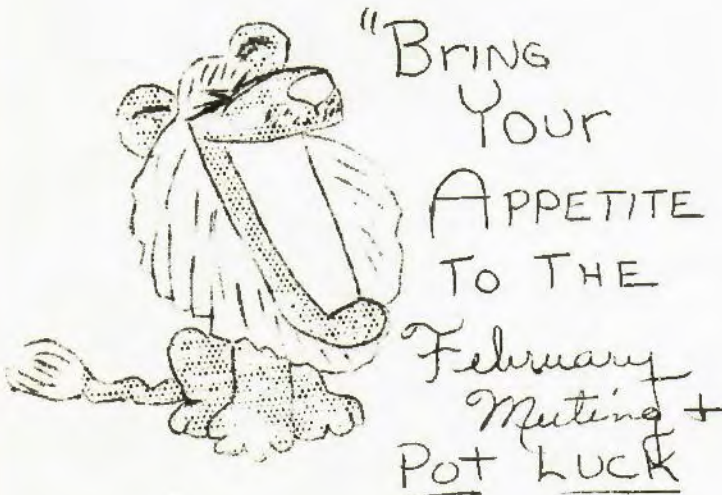
Dues are to be paid no later than Feb. meeting or you will not receive the newspaper in March.

NUTS AND BOLTS

Rebuilding gasoline gauges can be easy if a few simple rules are followed. To check if gauge is sticking, car can be rocked. If gauge oscillates freely, it's okay. Vintage Auto has proper tools for easy disassembly. When gauge registers full, the cork touches the top of tank or approximately one gallon will remain in tank for reserve, when cork is so adjusted. To adjust, tank filler cap and screen is removed and a wire can be used to adjust gauge. If gauge has a jerky movement, it may be touching the filler screen. This also can be adjusted with a stiff wire.

Using tools mentioned above, you may need to replace gaskets in gauge glass. These are available, and while you have this all apart, re-chroming will make this part of dash more presentable.

Last month we were rebuilding the C engine. Experience so far has taught us when looking for a C block, examine very carefully for cracks. These tend to show up only after all carbon and rust, dirt and other accumulations are cleaned out. You may be just out looking for another block. More on this next time.

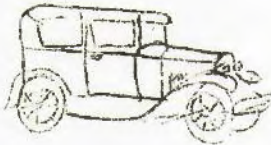
