We are real proud of all the girls who made those outstanding goodies for the bake sale, they sold out before I was able to sample all that was exhibited.



Several months ago we started rebuilding a C engine, and a cost list was promised. Well, the engine is in and running and here is the cost.

from the engine parts.

Cost of the block, purchased at pomona swapmeet was \$30.00 and the double B crank cost \$10.00. Dipping block was \$10.00 and sell worth the money, as this removes considerable scale and rust from cooling system. Also small cracks in block show up after carbon is removed. So, after all items are finally added together the engine cost is \$312.33. A Floto Motor Kit was installed at the cost of \$17.95.

Now to the credits. The writer would still be trying to start the engine without the expert help of Larry Boef (alias Boef, Boef, Boef). Don't let him tell you he doesn't know about A and C engines. Thanks again Larry. Jon Heiland at Vintage was a big help, so go see Jon for help too.
