

NUTS AND BOLTS by Maynard Grunklee

This month we are going to give you some cost figures on the C engine rebuilding. The machine work can be done at any reliable machine shop that does engine work. Valve seats cost \$2.00 per seat if needed. To surface the block cost was \$9.00. Unfortunately the writer had to sleeve this engine block which cost \$10.00 each cylinder. Crank shaft grinding was \$12.00. To re surface the head, cost was \$4.00. When you remove all head bolts or studs it is wiso to not break off in block as removal can be costly and time comsuming. The machine shop does this on a time basis. By soaking all studs in rust cutter for several weeks, your luck in removing old studs should be good. More next time on this.

There were no broken bones even though there were a few tumbles.



A few hungry or thirsty members adjourned to Lucky's Pizza Palor in Orange afterwards.


GOSSIP COLUMN




During a parachute jump, Stew Sale broke his right shoulder. He will be layed up for about 6 weeks. Hurry up and got well and wear a suit of armor mext time.
