NUTS AND BOLTS by Naynard Grunkloo

OVERHEATING CAUSES:

Some of the troubles that will cause overheating are: too much driving on low speed; not enough lubricating oil; carbonized cylenders or combustion chambers; spark retarded too far; colgged muffler; insufficie left to exhaust valves; poor carbureter adjustment; clogged radiator tubes; fan not working properly on account of broken or slipping boct; and loaking piston rings. Probably the most frequent trouble is leaking radiator on loose fan belt, or water loss from a water pump. Never tighten the packang nut on the water pump more than necessary to stop loak. When packing nut reaches the end of threads it will be necessary to back off and insort more packing. Old packing need not removed. Be sure to wrap additional packing on shaft in direction in which the nut is tighteded ..






