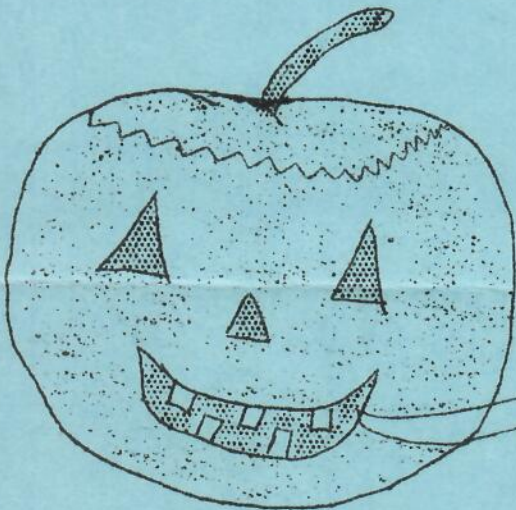

NUTS AND BOLTS

OVERHEATING CAUSES:

Some of the troubles that will cause overheating are: too mush driving on low speed; not enough lubricating oil; carbonized cylinders or combustion chambers; spark retarded too far; colgged muffler; insufficient left to exhaust valves; poor carburetor adjustment; clogged radiator tubes; fan not working properly on account of broken or slipping belt; and leaking piston rings. Probably the most frequent trouble is leaking radiator on loose fan bolt, or water loss from a water pump. Never tighten the packing nut on the water pump more than necessary to stop leak. When packing nut reaches the end of threads it will be necessary to back off and insert more packing. Old packing need not removed. Be sure to wrap additional packing on shaft in direction in which the nut is tightened..

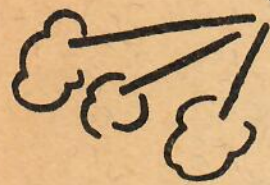

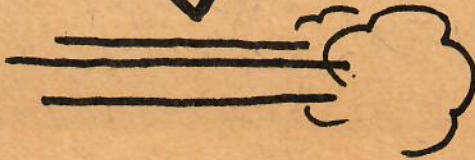

30 points possible

20 points possible

C. The scoring is to remain secret. Score sheets remain the property of Orange County Model A Club.

D. Anyone interfering with or disputing a judge's decision will be disqualified. Decision is final.
