# NUTS AND BOLTS by Haynard Grunklee

Hore instrument panel lamp assemblies are damaged through improper removal and installation of the cap, from any other sorce. Hany owners and mechanics use a twisting movement when removing or installing the cap. This invariable results in damage to the assembly.

To remove the instrument panel cap first turn on the instrument panel light, then pull the cap straight backward. To install turn on the light, then line up the small depression in the cap, with notch in cap body and push cap straight in. Turning on the light, lines up the tonque or groove inside of the lamp assembly with the notch in the cap body and permits very easy removal or installation of the cap. 
