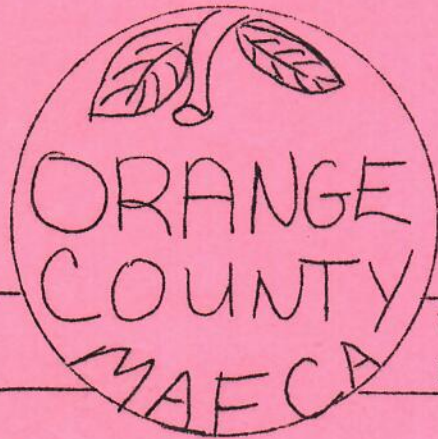

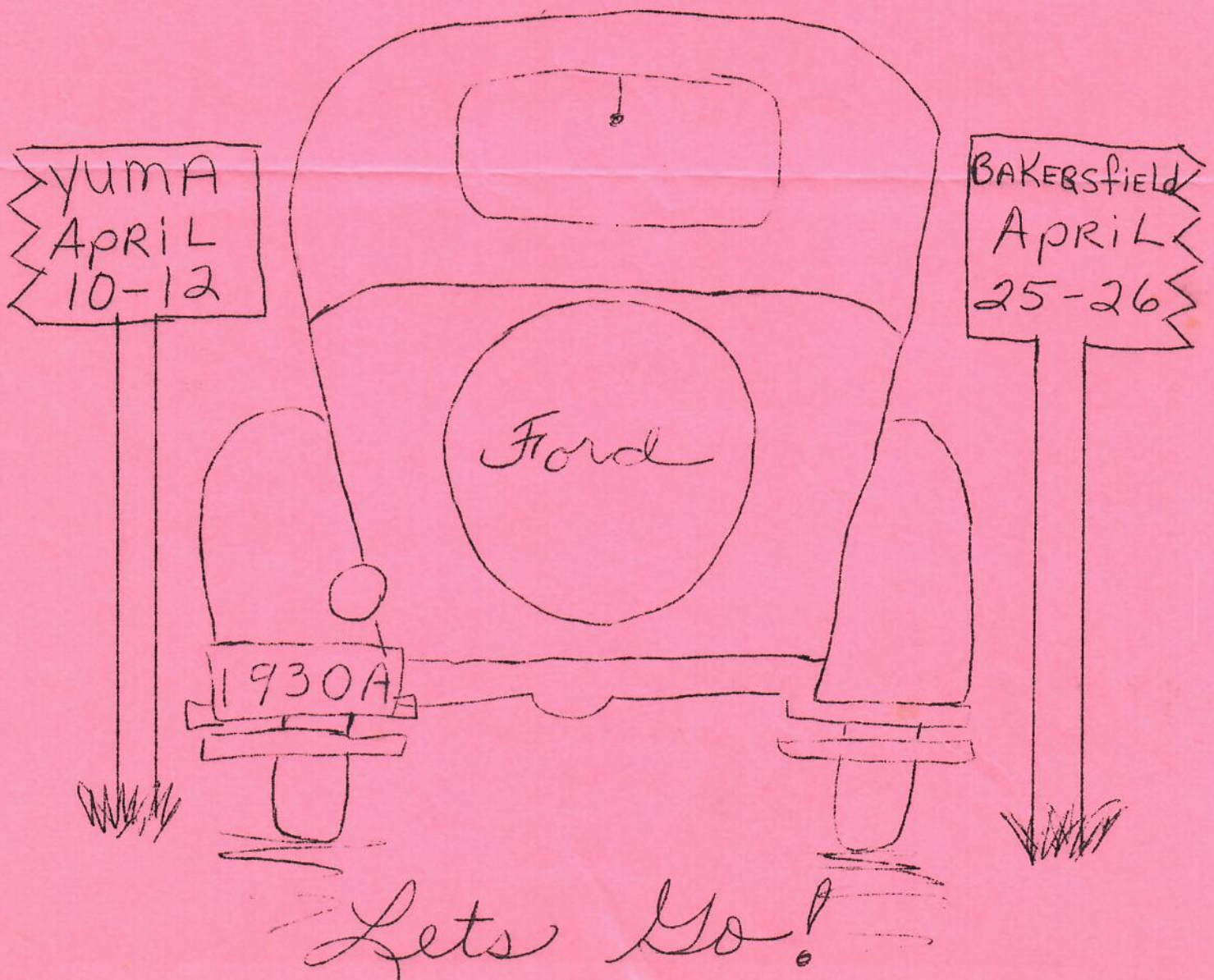

TECHNICALLY SPEAKING

If you are in need of a good door to replace that battered loose fitting door on your closed cab pickup check on a door from a Tudor. They fit very nicely.

When restoring the gearshift lever, difficulty is often experoined when the spring is compressed. far enough to reinstall the keeper. This can be simplified by cutting five coils off the spring. This greatly relieves the tension and assembles much easier, and in no way interferes with normal operation.

Many 'A' restorers get into trouble by removing the body from the frame to do a good job of restoration the problems occur when reassembly takes place since much careful shimming is necessary to make proper hood alignment and door fit. In order to successfully accomplish this job it is necessary to begin by mounting the radiator and the cowl section of the body. These steps must be done first and with the greatest of care to make proper alignment of the hood. Tighten the cowl mounting bolts securely. This operation can be followed by shimming to make proper door fit from front to back and finally seduring the rear body bolts.

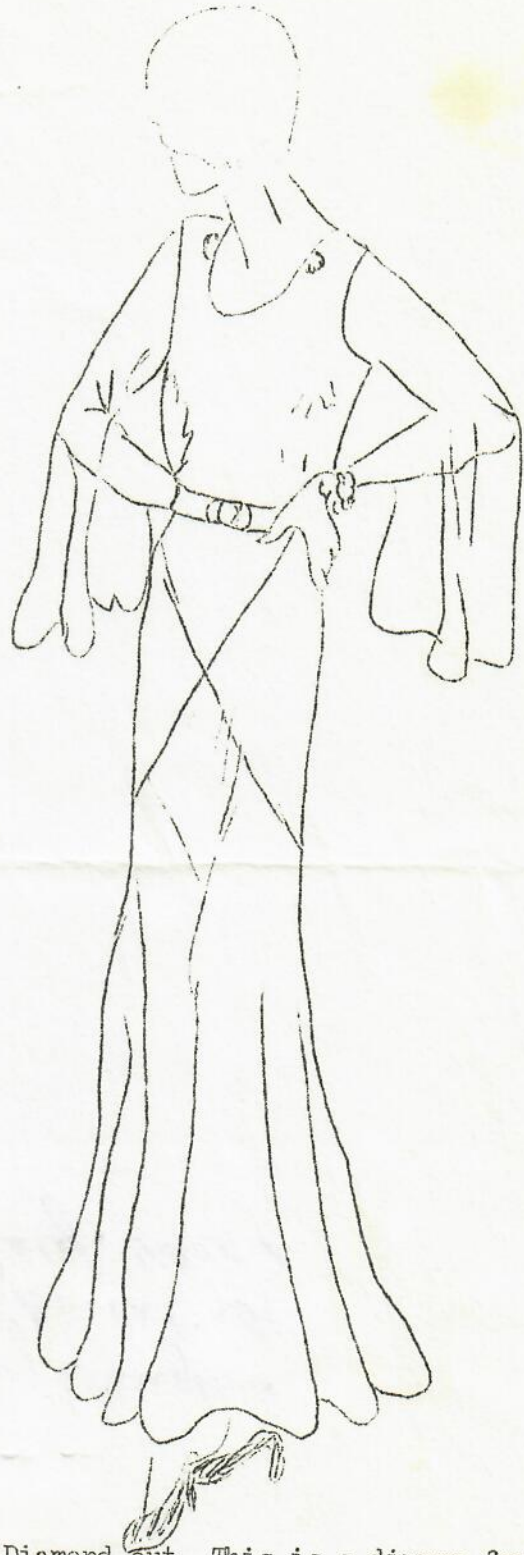
