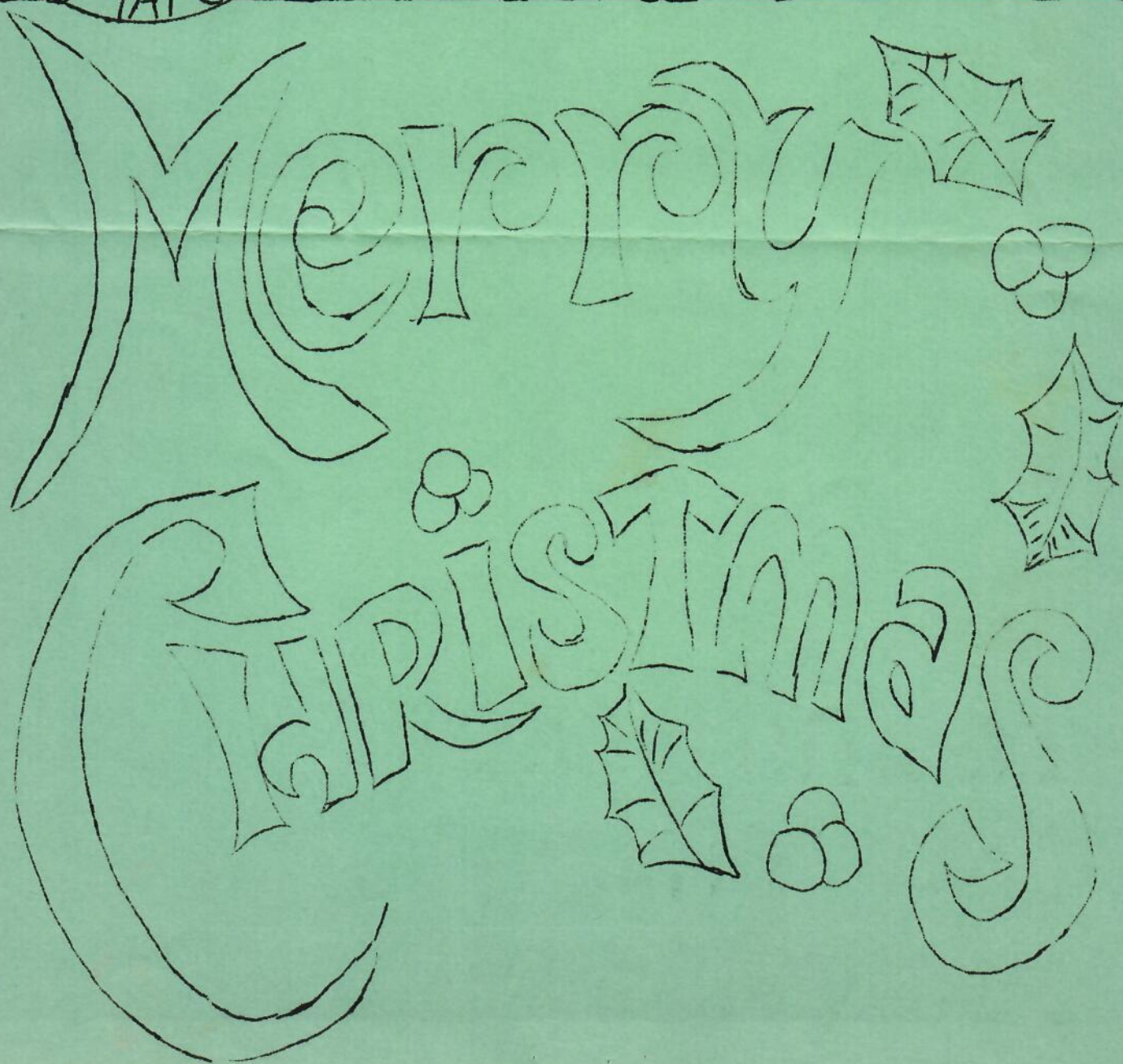

Technically Speaking

"HELPFUL HINTS"

The two fuel lines, tank to dash and dash to carburetor, were originally made by double gap rolling sheet brass then tinning them to seal them. Authentic-looking reproductions can be made of copper or brass tubing, then have them dull tinned or even cadmium plated.

Often it is less expensive to have an old Model A radiator recored than to buy one of the current new reproductions. The original water tanks not only preserve the Ford name and authenticity but are much stronger than the new reproductions. The new cores are better in cooling capacity to the original cores because the tubes are oval rather than circular.

To get that like new appearance on old black sidewall tires, coat them with the paste type black shoe polish, then rub them briskly with a cloth to blend in the polish and remove excess.
