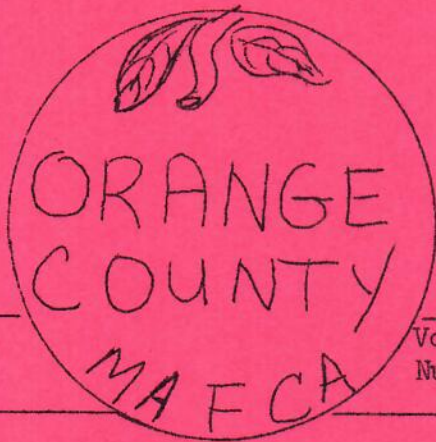

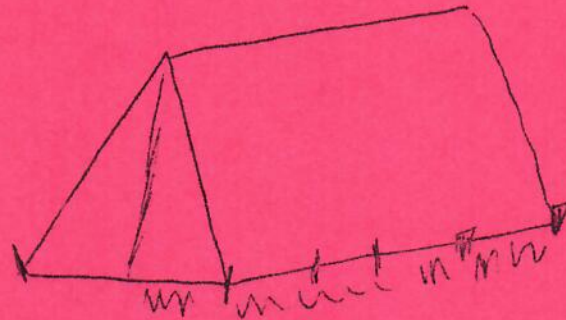

One of the tougher problems in restoring a Model A is getting a beautiful finish on the wheels and keeping them in the condition is equally as rough. To prepare them for a good finish the wheels should be sandblasted to remove all chipped and cracked paint as well as dirt and grease. Then the wheels must be primed with a good metal primer immediately. Wheels should be painted with enamel because laquer does not have the flexibility required at this point. Much time and trouble can be eliminated by making a fixture from an old front hub and spindle that would permit rotation of the wheels during the painting process.

While spraying make certain that each spoke is thoroughly covered without runs. If a fixture is used as suggested and runs do occur, the wheel can be rotated to minimize the heaviness of the runs.

Many beautiful painted wheels have been damaged by tire mounting and wheel installation.

Model A tires can be mounted without the use of tools. Lubricate the bead with rubber lube or a good soap solution. With the wheel lying on a blanket or rug on the low bench the tire can be formed on, one bead at a time, without the use of anything but your hands. Always inflate, deflate and reinflate the tube to get a good location in the tire.

Remove the paint where the leveled edge of the lug nut will seat, to avoid chipping when installing the finished wheel.
