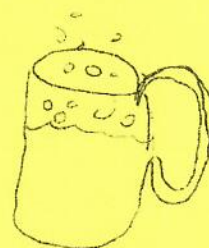

There are some '28 and '29 A's with the later
steering columns that need to be changed. I
changed mine and find nothing wrong with the
early type.

I found a column and steering wheel at the
Orange Co. Swap Meet for \$5.00. The steering
wheel was nothing but metal. But after a re-
molding it was like new. Next, I painted it
and got the spark and throttle controls plat-
ed I had to buy a light switch rod and while
the control rods were plated I had my dash
a few other small things done. The cost was
as Follows:

Column and wheel	\$5.00
Remolding	22.00
Light switch rod	13.00
Plating=	12.00

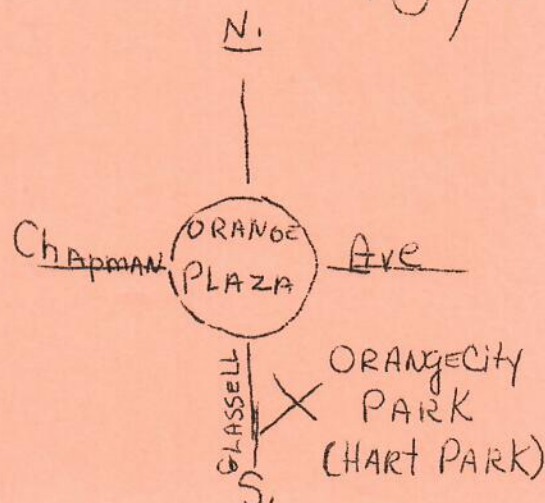

- #3-All Cars to maintain a distance of 100ft. between cars. All cars to be able to maintain 45 m.p.h. and be able to keep up with tour leader who will set pace.
- #4-All cars to remain in position during tour so as not to confuse others in procession.
- #5-Tour leader will have a map on route to be traveled on tour, and will show all drivers said route.
- #6-All members going on tours to be at designated startin point 30 minutes prior to leaving time to familiarize themselves with the route to be taken on said tour.
