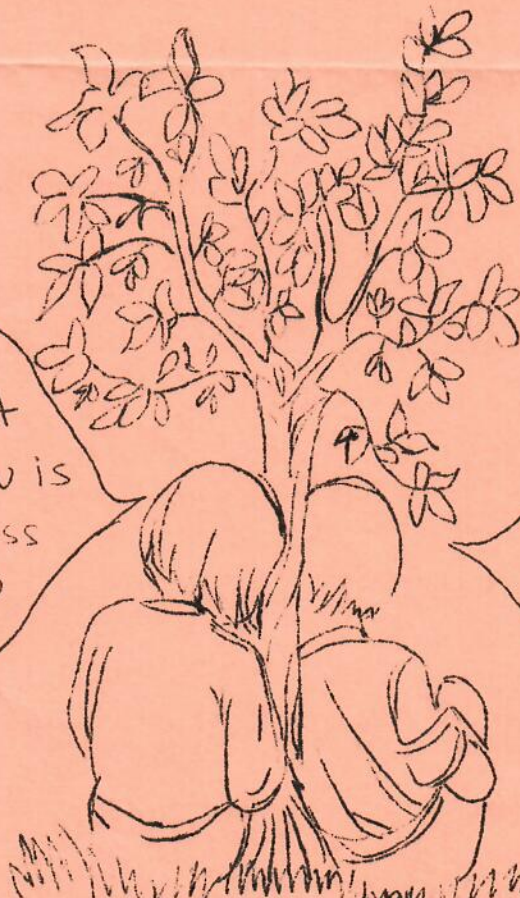

3395 - This dress in crêpe has leg-o-mutton sleeves, tucked on the forearm and tucks trim effectively. Inserted front flare and bloused waistline.

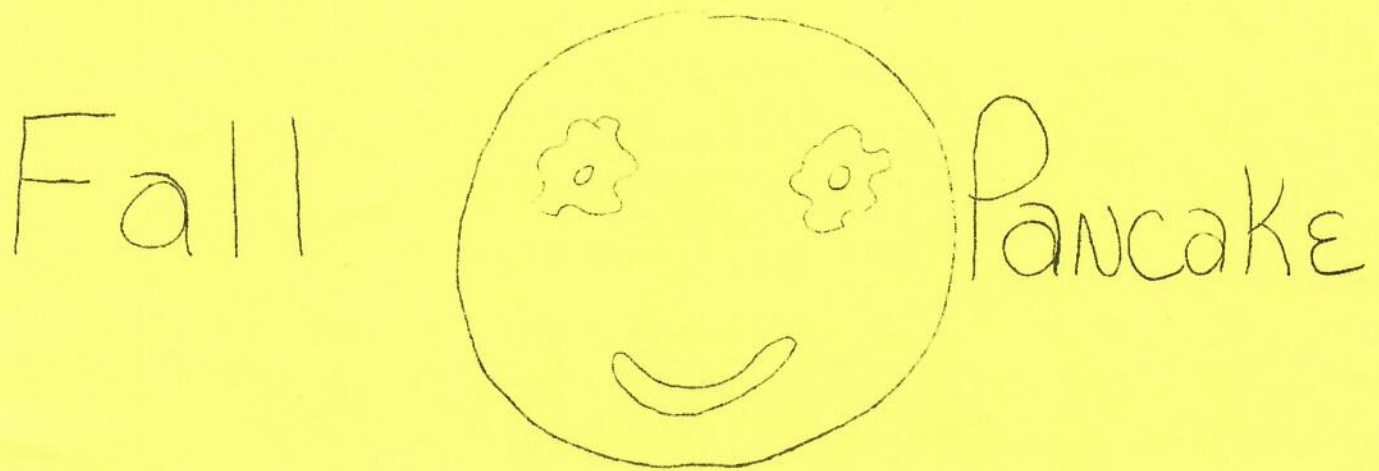
