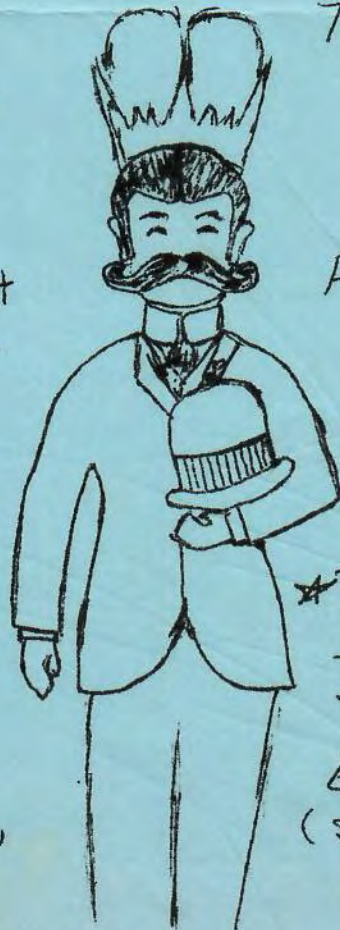

JUNE CALENDAR

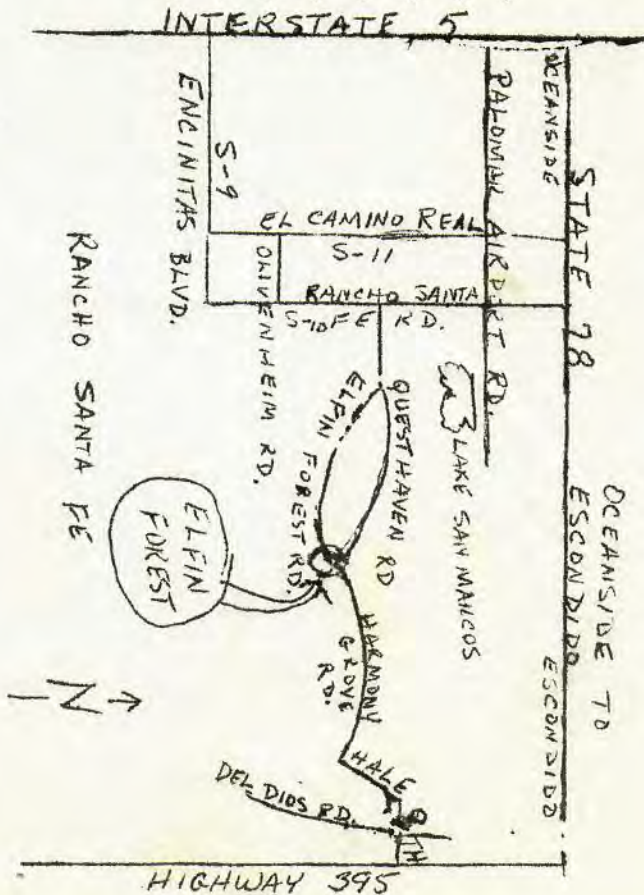

Just a reminder about our big fun weekend in June. It's our campout on the 19th and 20th at Elfin Forrest down by Escondido. More at the next meeting. See you there.

Here is some more info. on Elfin Forest that I forgot to include with the map. I told you I was a little disorganized this month!! The price for clubs with 10 units or more is \$2.50 per day per unit and check out time is 2:00 PM. You may take motor bikes if you wish but they must be ridden outside the park area. 5 MPH from camp to nearest park exit. Hours: 8:00 AM to sundown. Also they must have arresters and baffles. NO LOUD BIKES. If you don't take a bike and you want something to do they rent horses for \$2,50 per hour or \$1.50 per half hour and have trail rides(with guide) for \$1.50 per half hour. They also have boats for rent as follows: small row boats - \$1.00 per hour, large row boats - \$1.50 per hour, Yak-yaks - \$1.00 per hour (limit 1 person), and pedal boats - \$1.50 per 1/2 hour (two people). There is a store on the grounds, fishing, hiking trails, softball diamond, volleyball court,

badminton, horseshoes, archery and a childrens play area. The address and phone number (in case you want to leave them with someone in case of emergencies)are: Box 211, Route #5 Escondido, Calif. Phone 744-2444. To get there from Interstate 5 go East on State 78 to Rancho Santa Fe Rd. Turn South past Lake San Marcos to Questhaven Rd. Then turn East on Questhaven two miles to Elfin Forest Rd. Follow Elfin Forest Rd. 2 1/2 miles to Elfin Forest Ranch.

From U.S. 395 turn West on 9th Ave. in Escondido. Then go South on Halo Rd. to Harmony Grove Rd. Follow signs seven miles to Elfin Forest.

There now you have a map and directions, you can't possibly get lost, can you?

"Got a Thumpy Clutch?"

What causes the "thump, thump, thump" in the clutches of some Fords?

When the engine is idling, do you notice a definite knock which changes to a thump when the car is driven away?

Check the fly-wheel housing. It is necessary that the fly wheel housing be in very accurate alignment with the fly wheel due to the extreme "close fit" between the various parts of the clutch.

Does your gear shift lever jump out of High into Neutral, when the car hits a bump or is slowed down after driving fast?

Put a deeper notch in your gear shifter rods and a stronger spring behind the latch that holds the gear shifter yokes in position. Most often this ends the problem.

Many people ask, "Does it harm your Model A to drive it at a 60 mile per hour speed?"

Henry's answer was always a reminder that the now Ford (1929) was designed to run at high speeds as any car. BUT REMEMBER: Speed always costs! Isn't that right. . . Dom Antonacci, Roland Ferris and Jim Marsh. . . alias the local speed demons.

Also June meeting will be pot luck and weather permitting we'll picnic outside. See ya all there.

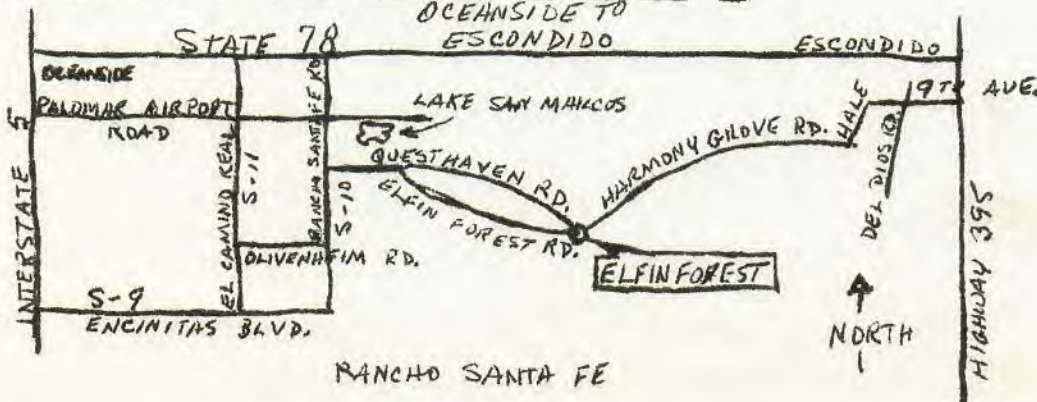
