This year your Technical Advisor would like to try a new slant on this article but I am going to need a lot of help so here goes. We would like questions about problems, mechanical or maintenance. The questions to start this article off should be turned in to your Technical Advisor by Jan. 13 meeting. All questions and answers that can be given will appear in the February Distributor. Any questions that cannot be answered by that paper will be answered at the February meeting. However, if this program snowballs into a ream of paper, and lets hope it does, we may have to addapt a few changes to relieve our editor. Your question or questions should be written on a piece of paper containing your name and phone number if possible. Don't forget I need your help so all you members fire those questions in.

KEEP A KOOL A

Your Technical Advisor would like to take this time to review a small point that is often overlooked when reconditioning your engine.

After your block is assembled and painted place a piece of cardboard over studs to bring the head flush with the top of stud bolts. Now you can spray your head and remove without scoring or chipping the paint. Right here care must be taken to assure yourself that the spark plug seat gasket boss is free of any paint. This can be done by applying grease on this boss before painting. If you have already painted and did not do this you are inhibiting the heat rejection of your sparkplug by approximately 60%. The sparkplug gets its ground for good ignition and heat rejection at this point and paint is a very good insulator. If you forgot to do this you are giving up a fraction of horsepower and spending too much time cleaning and regaping fouled plugs.
