

KEEP A KOOL "A" by Hal Martin, Tech. Adv.

With the Seattle Tour just around the corner and many hard road miles ahead, it appears to be a good time for an under the hood check.

To begin a recheck start with the radiator, remove lower hose at radiator and insert a rag into radiator lower pipe and hose to block. Next fill radiator to top and pull the rag out of pipe several times to flush radiator of any loose rust and deposits. Then do the same thing to the block by allowing water to flow into radiator and out lower hose holding water back at hose pipe on radiator. A small amount of antifreeze compound added or water soluable oil. Remember, don't use the proverb "If a little bit helps a whole lot will halp a whole lot more." Next rocheck timing by going thru timing proceedure outlined in Model A Ford service bulletins pages 210, 211, and 346. Remember if you do not have this publication, your club has and it is available to

be used by you anytime.

The problem of condensor failure may be slowed or stopped completely by installation of a distributor heat baffle - Ford part # A-12280 as outlined in service bulletins figure 803, page 398. This baffle would be very important add-on for those harty soles taking the Inland Route to Seattle. Next on check list would be all wheel bearings and a very good brake adjustment for the added drag of bad bearings and brake shoes adds many extra BTU to radiator to dissipate in form of heat. possible other causes for over heating.
