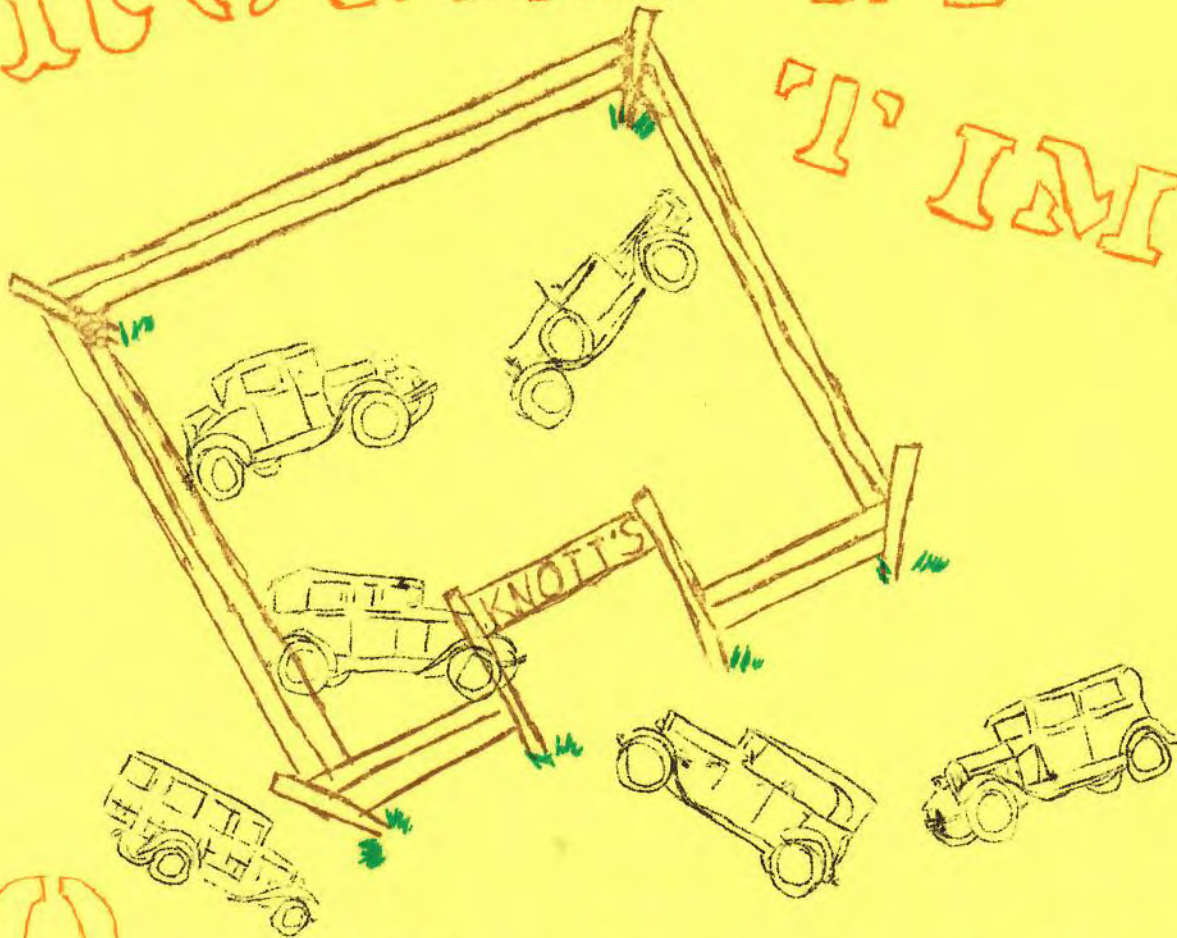

KEEP A KOOL "A"

This month we are covering four points which should be checked on a regular basis but are often overlooked.

Point 1 Clutch Pedal Adjustment: The clutch pedal should be adjusted up to the point where the pedal will travel approximately 3/4 of an inch before the clutch starts to disengage. If you find this distance less than this amount, it indicates the friction faces have worn. Remove steel pin from clutch clevis and screw rod in to increase pedal movement.

Point 2 Check Front Wheel Side Play. Jack up front wheels and spin to observe tracking. With the weight removed from ground grab top and bottom or both sides, shake and observe amount of movement. Do not mistake spindle bushing wear for bearing wear. Insert a cold chisel between spindle and axle when making this test to take up any spindle bushing play.

Adjustment of bearing play is very important for proper tire wear and front end wear. The adjusting nut should be tightened until the hub just starts to bind. Then back off one or two notches on adjusting nut until wheel revolves freely. Be sure to replace cotter pin after adjustment.

Point 3 The Fan Belt is very important for two reasons, cooling and generation. The belt should be only tight enough to insure no slippage. Overtightening only knocks out rear generator bushing by applying too much load.

Point 4 Lubrication of Distributor Shafts following recommendations of Model "A" Lube chart.

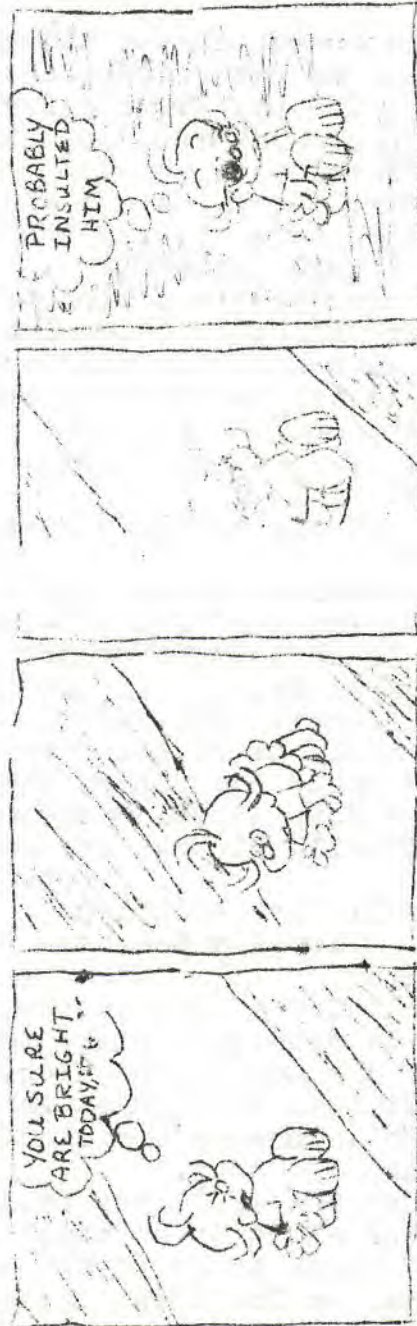
