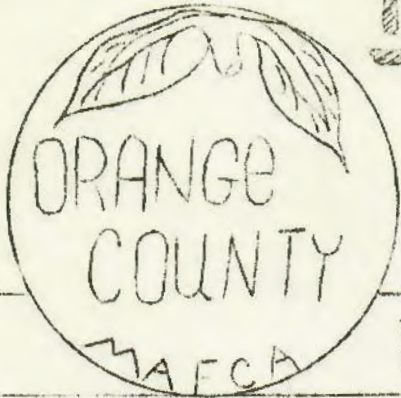


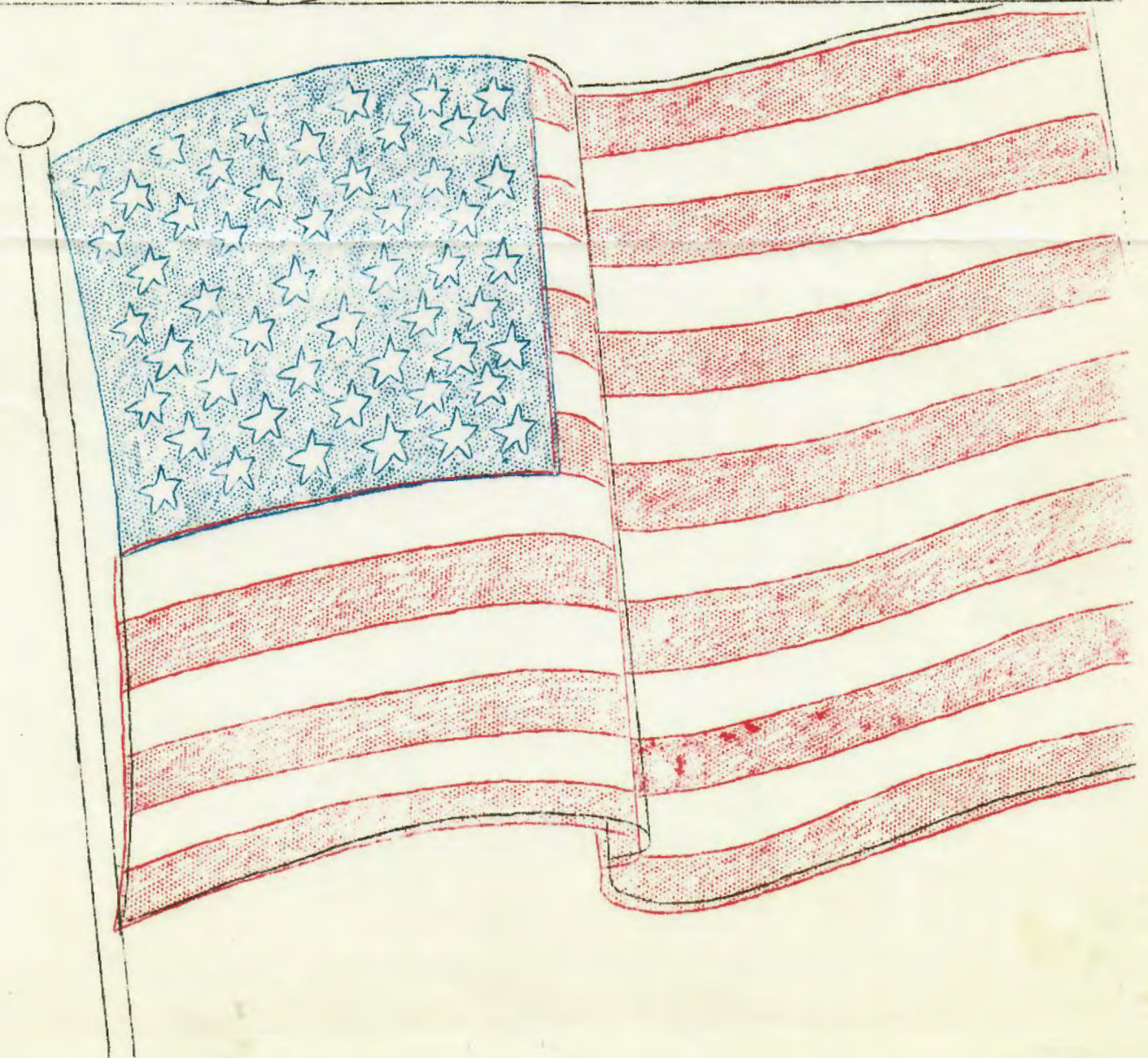

MARSH'S MESSAGE

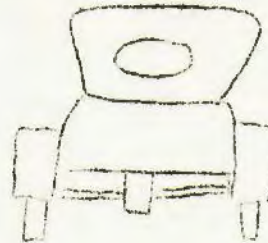
