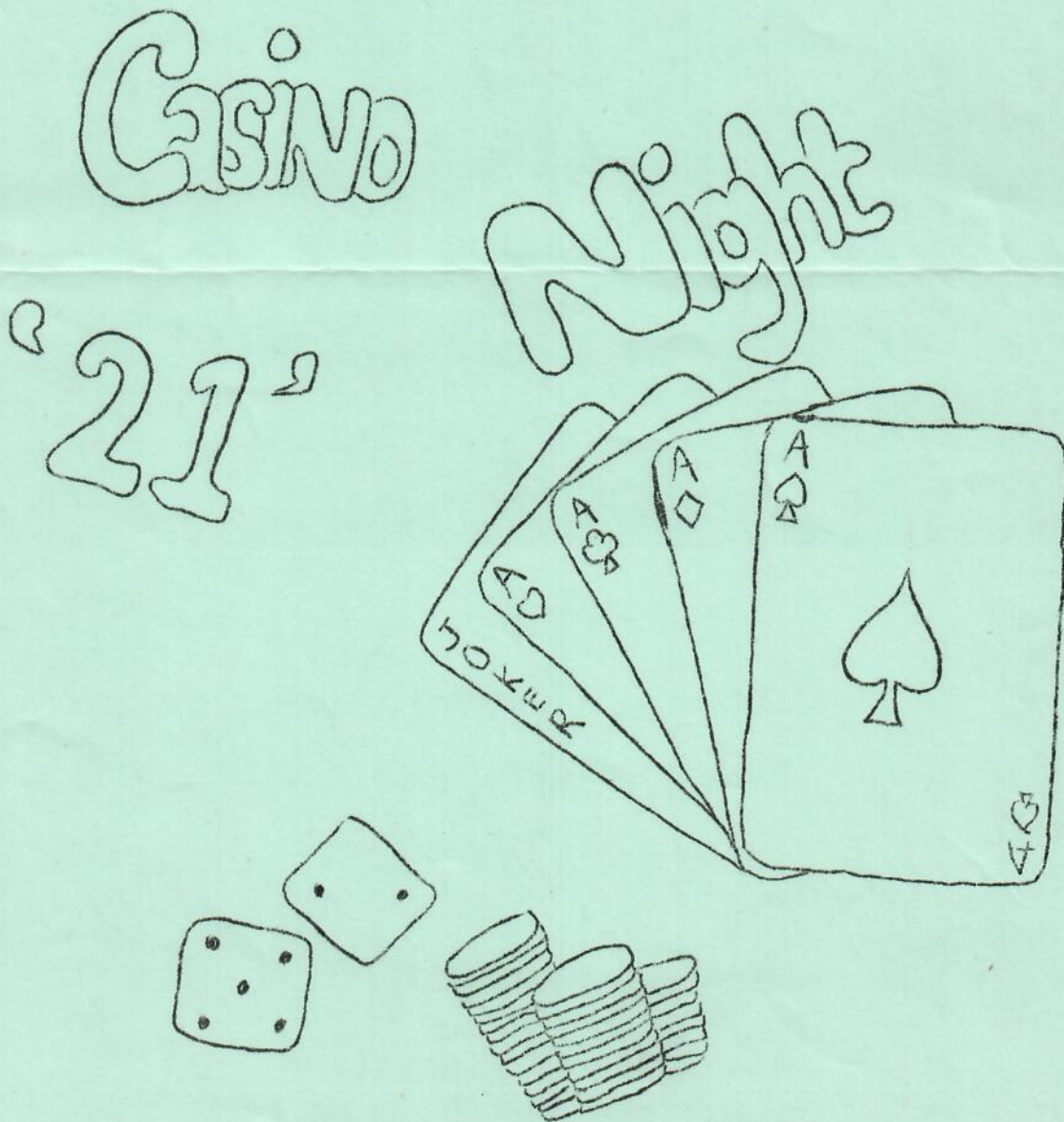

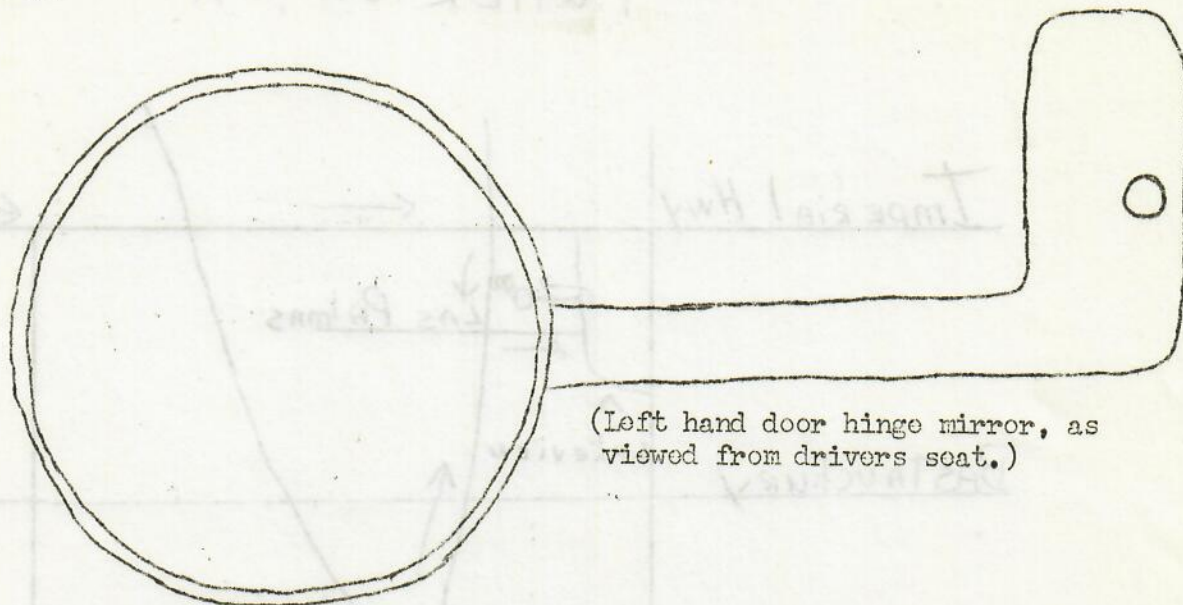

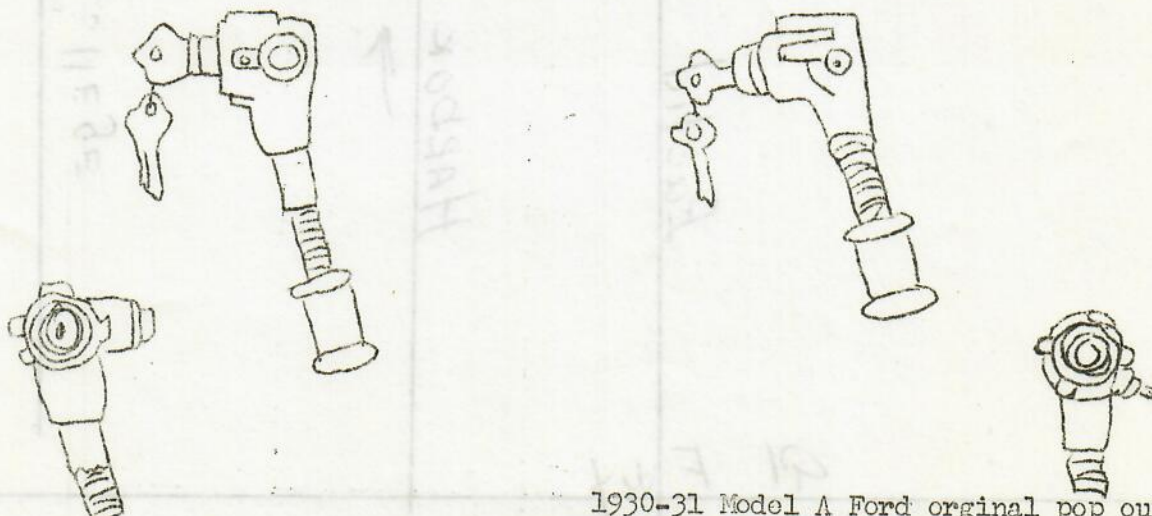
So....save the date; start looking around for a Hawaiian outfit; and, of course, polish up the "A" ---you'll get mileage credit.

(Left hand door hinge mirror, as viewed from drivers seat.)

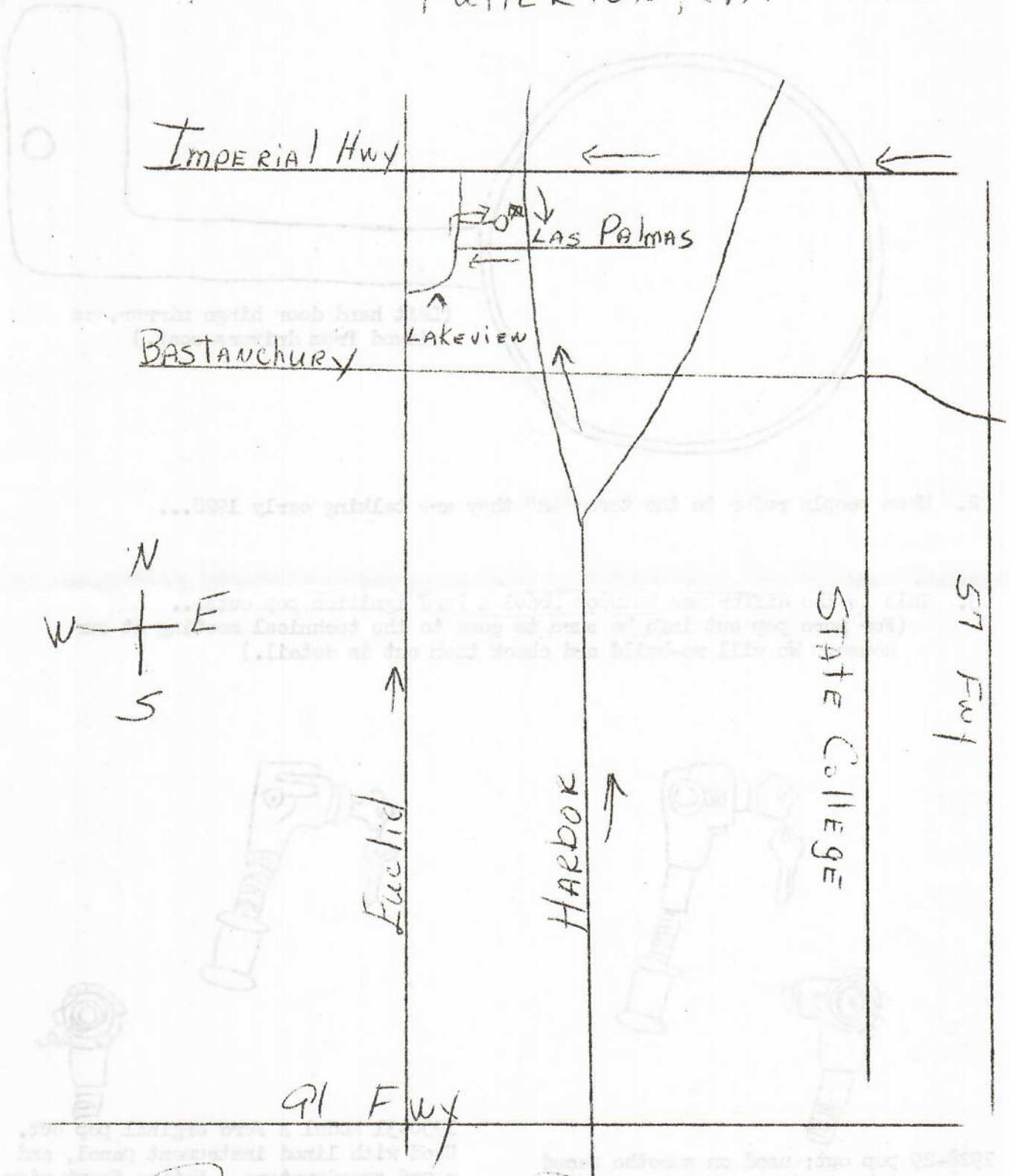
2. When people refer to the term "AR" they are talking early 1928...

1928-29 pop out; used on smooth faced instrument panel (with oval speedometer, up to June 1930 and until an assembly plant had used up its stock.

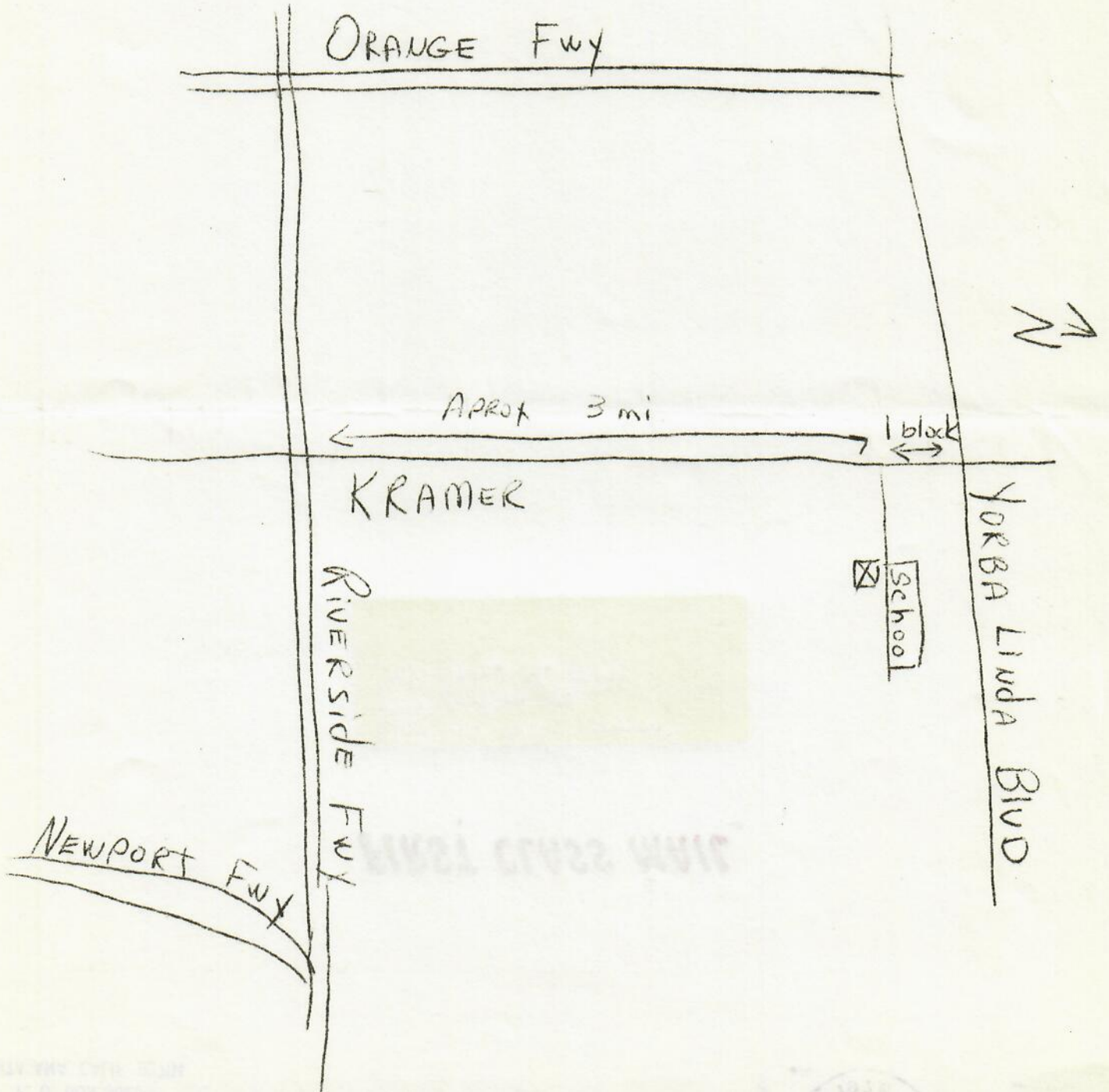
