Women: Hose
Silk or rayon hose for day or evening. Lisle for sports.
Some side clocks. All had seams.

Men: Hose
Silk or lisle with many clocks. Kneehigh golf socks in wool or lisle with knickers. Black silk for evening dresswear.

ACCESSORIES (Major items) Women:

Purses were either envelope or snap top, never large for ddgywear. Snap top with chain handle or evening cimpacts for evening Gloves were often of gauntlet design, were often colored, all lenghts and either matched or complimented the costume. Jewelry: Costume jewelry was very popular with many decorative pins of metal and stones. Necklasses of metals

Jewelry: Costume jewelry was very popular with many decorative pins of metal and stones. Necklaces of mock stones and metal came in all lengths, with earrings and bracelets to match. Every color of crystal in all lengths were very good and pearls were in fashion in 1931. Watch for era type fasteners. Earrings were of the screw type in either button or drop style. Most women wore wristwatches. Finger rings.

Eyeglasses Bows came off from the middle of the frames. Some lorgnettes for evening. Pin on type used by business w women.

Men:

Canes were used for dress daywear and evening
Cufflinks on most outfits
Pocket watches and fobs, few wristwatches
Tie pins and collar holders
Belts, plain leather with metal buckles
Gloves of either smooth leather or suede
Eyeglasses with bows coming off the middle of the frame
