

- A. This dress is green voile. The hem is turned on the right side and bound with scallops of blue linen into which blue linen dolphins are leaping. The eyes and bubbles and repeated on the shoulder yokes where the binding is also blue.
- B. This dress is of white voile with a light blue handkerchief lined facing making as ocean on which float white appliqued boats with pink sales both of handkershief linen.
- C. This little dress was made of rose voile with pink linen bindings and appliques. The scalloped shells are buttonholed around with rose, the flutings being indicated with rose outline stitch and then slip stitched into place as sleeve caps and tiny pockets.
