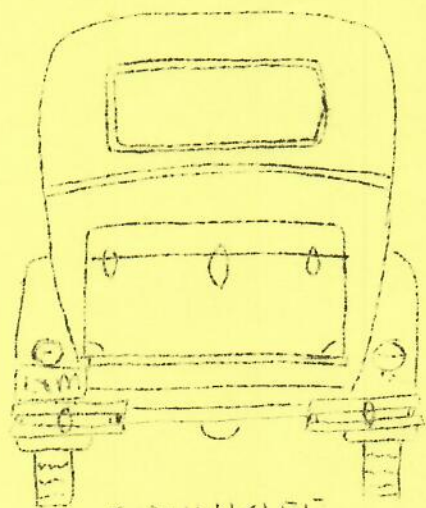

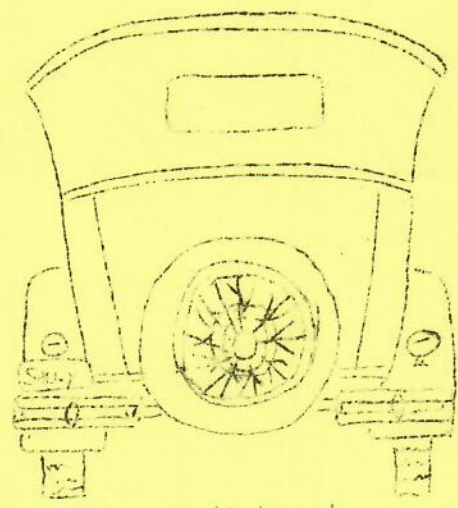

Each number represents a particular item that Ford patented up to the time of the Model "A". They are as follows:

- 1012620 Motor vehicle 1911, three spring
- 1044038 Spring suspension 1912, cross spring
- 1075557 Three part suspension 1913
- 1467478 Metallic vehicle wheel 1923, wire wheel
- 1568505 Nonglare headlite lens 1926, & lamp therefore
- 1629493 Body construction 1927 pertaining to gas tank in the cowl
- 1640118 Split valve guides 1927, Mushroom stems

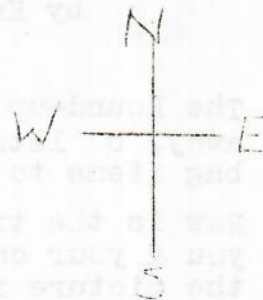
