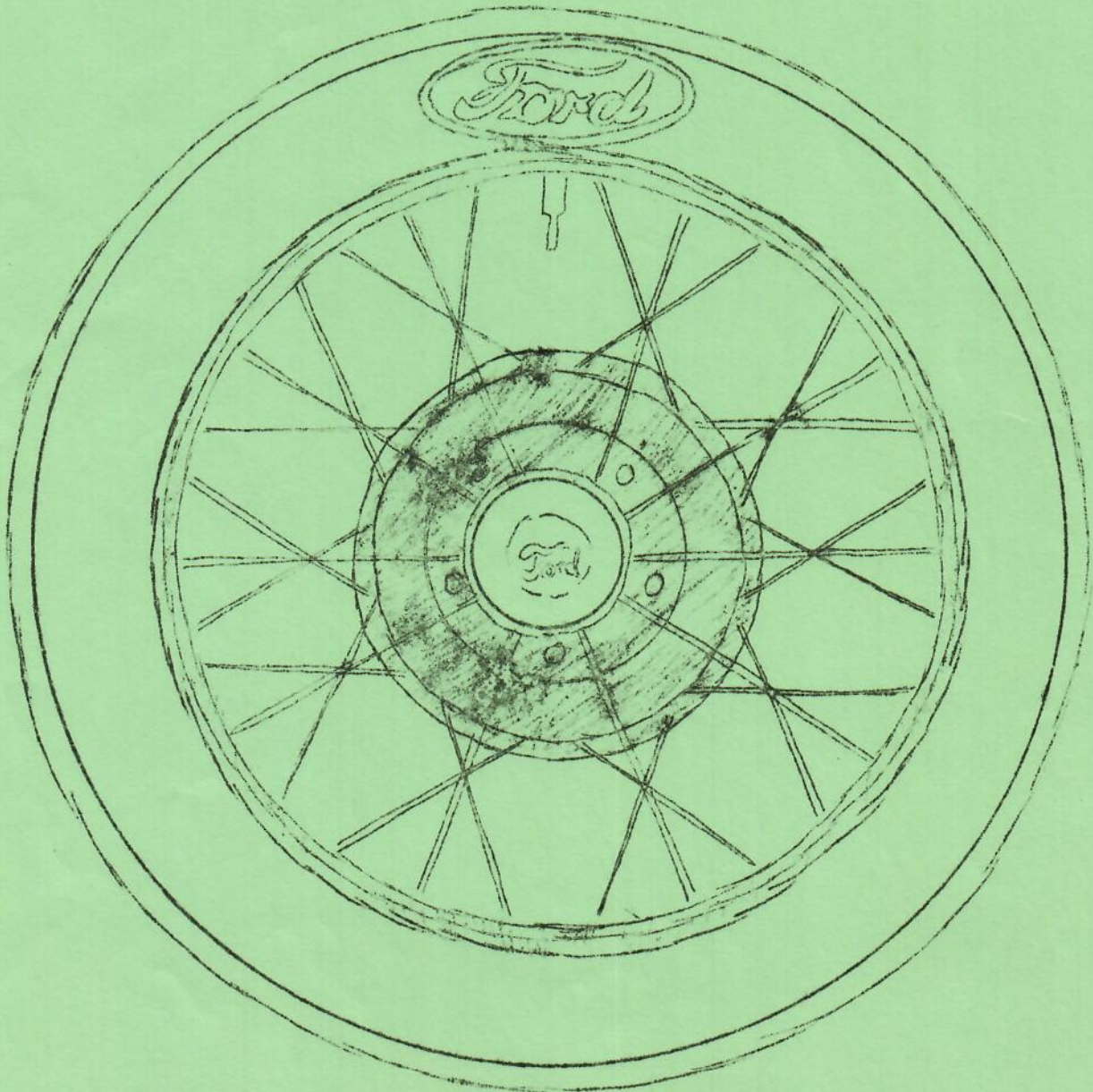

JOE'S JARGON

Gasoline Shut Off Valve

It has been brought to your Technical Advisor attention that there has been some trouble with gasoline shut off valves.

I will try at this time to help you with the Restoring of this valve.

After more than 40 years of use the valve is often so well eaten that it is difficult to pull out. First take off handle. Then the packing nut. Drill a 1/16 inch diameter hole at right angle through the stem at a point close to the body of the valve.. Use a 1/16 inch acetylene welding rod and run one

end through the hole you have just drilled. Bend up both ends so they can be clamped in a vice with the aid of a piece of soft wood. Tap the body of the valve loose from the piston. Carefully remove any burrs that might have been made in drilling. The small hole in the valve stem will not show when the valve is reassembled. Remove packing from valve stem. Clean up valve body and valve piston with some fine valve grinding compound. Put some on the piston and some in the body. Put piston in valve body and replace packing nut. Install handle with back side forward. This is so you can turn piston back and forth and grind it in the same way you would grind the valves in your engine.

Repeat this process till you have a smooth surface on both piston and valve body. When satisfied, clean thoroughly and reassemble. The best compound to use around the stem & packing Dow Corning F S 1281 Compound. Smear around stem & Packing will lubricate the parts as well as prevent gasoline leaks on your new carpet. "Good Luck"

Thats it for now.

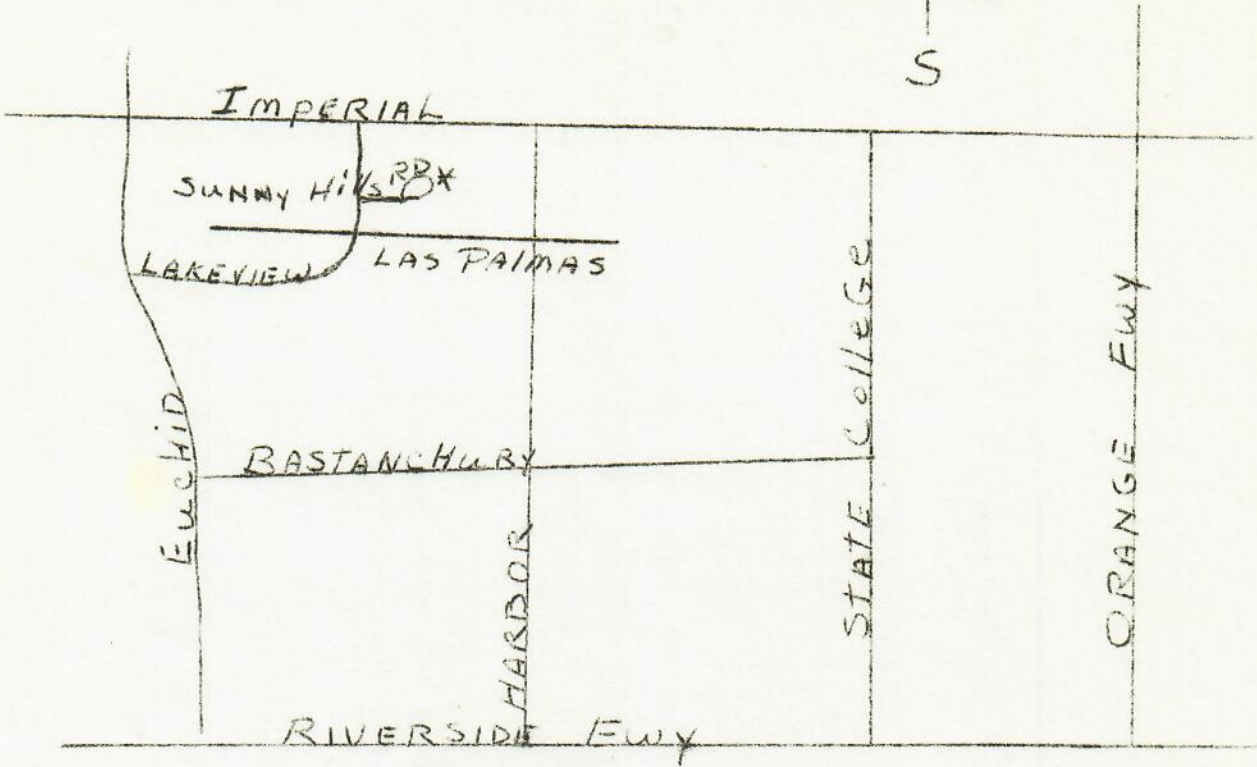
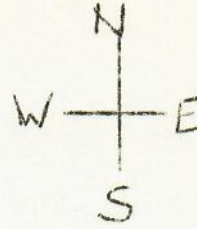
HARVEY-WALLBANGER SHERBERT
