

JOE'S JARGON by Joe Eatherton 545-1435

This month seminar will be at Larry Boef. He is going to assemble a Model "A" engine. Seminar will be the best hosts & hostesses around. Friday June 11 at 7 p.n. at his house. Map in this paper.

> This month meeting we are going to have Mr. Dick Mancinelli from Ditzler paint back again for moRE information on painting.

> This month tips will be Model "A" don't.

Don't over-tighten head studs. This can cause warped head & water leaks. Use recommended torque pressure & alternating pattern.

Don't forget to add a table spoon of engine oil to each cylinder before installing head. This protects cylinder walls upon starting the engine.

Don't tighten water pump packing nut to tight. This could cause pump shaft to become scored.

Don't start up a new engine before you add engine oil to the distributor shaft hole in the head. This fills up the oil pan tray. This helps to get oil to the rods in a hurry.

Don't blame your tired old Model "A" engine for lose of power at high speed. This could be caused by a weak camshaft spring. Replace with a new one.

Don't install head studs with out first cleaning out each hole first Head studs should protrude 2 3/4 inches above the top of the engine cont.


