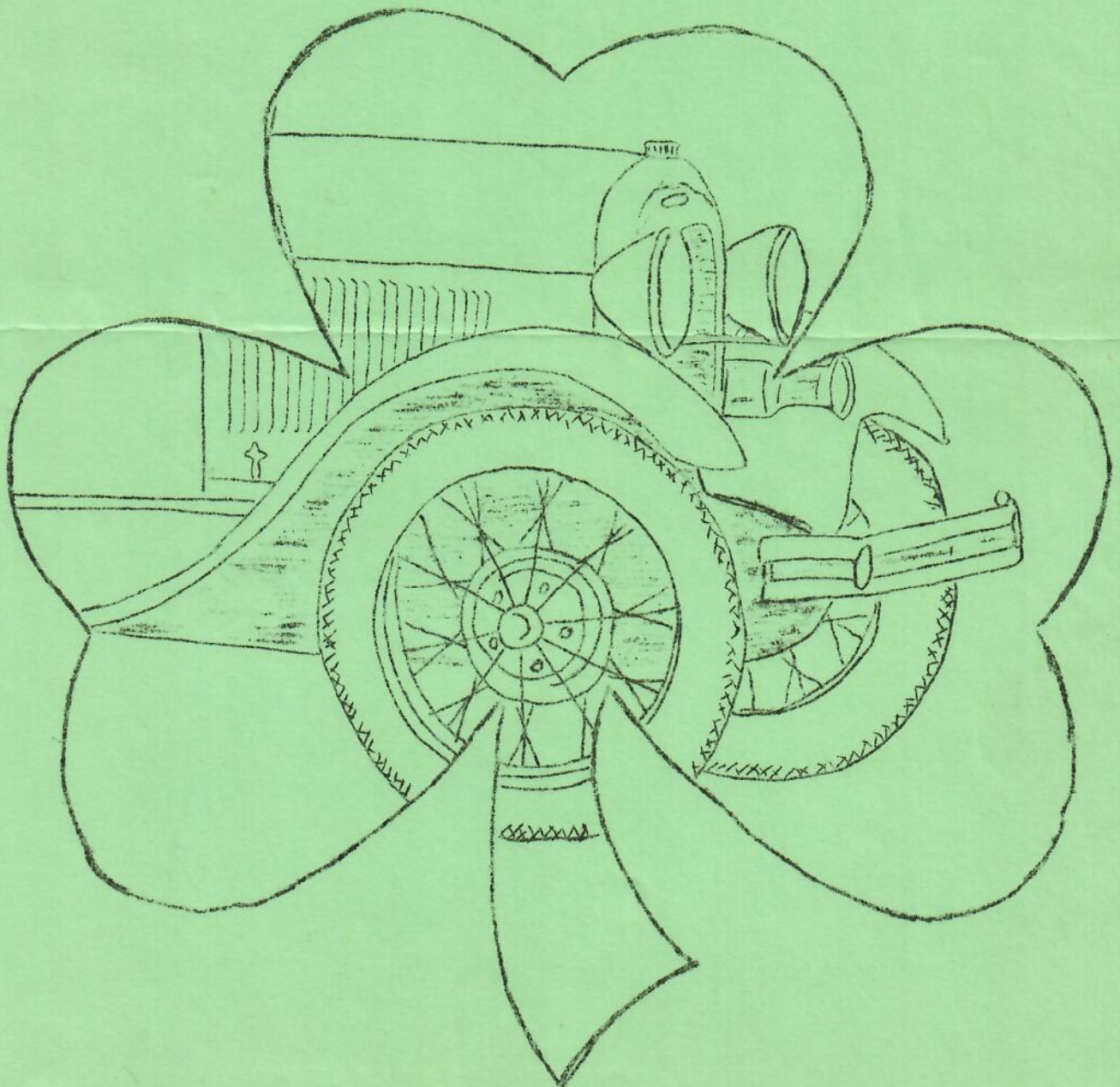

Here is a tip that should help with those bolts exposed to road moisture; Coat the threads of the bolts with milk of magnesia. the nuts will not rust, and can easily be removed years later.

Here is another tip on cork gaskets; Many times if you buy old stock cork gaskets, or they dry out hanging in your garage, you will find that they no longer fit. Soak them in warm water for a few minutes, and they will be restored to their original size.

The board unanimously decided to hold the 14th annual Round-up at the Movieland Wax Museum.

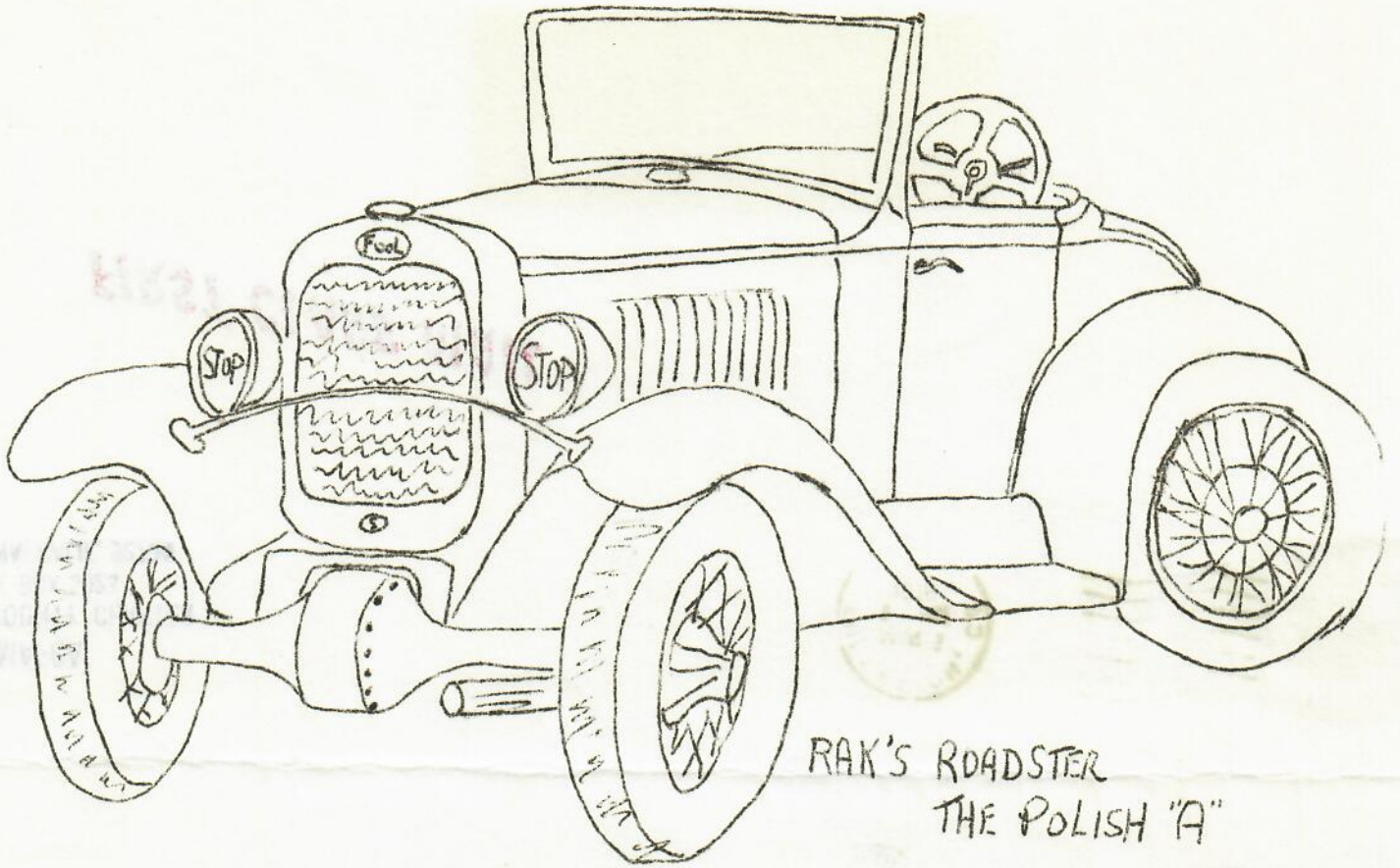

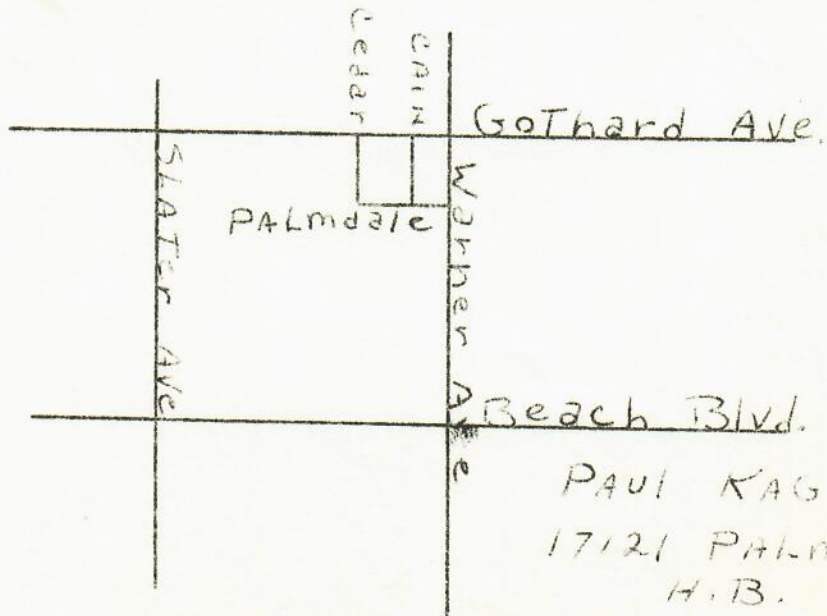
