

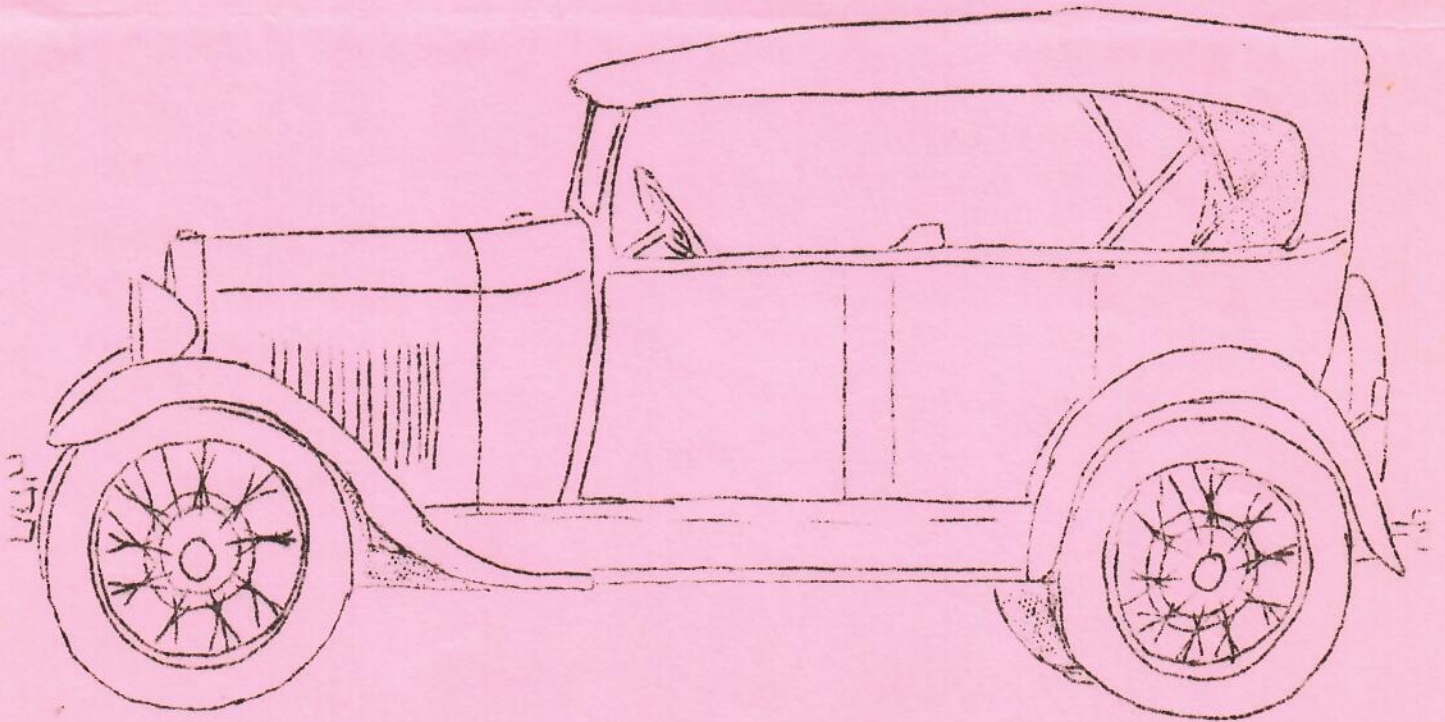

TIPS FOR THE LADIES

Activities report by Glenn Johnson. There wasn't any ACCC report.

Guidelines for starting your Model A. Open gas valve, place spark up, adjust mixture of choke by opening one full turn counter clockwise. If the engine is cold pull back the choke, as you engage the starter, then let it return as soon as possible. As soon as it starts move the spark all the way down. For warming up the engine adjust mixture to $\frac{1}{2}$ turn (choke) open, after it warms up move adjustment to between $\frac{1}{4}$ turn open and closed entirely, depending on how your car runs best.

Round-up chairman Phil Ricketts wasn't there, but he left Karl with the news that the Wax Museum said no on having the Annual Round-up there. The Town & Country Mall had been approached and the mall representatives were agreeable. After a discussion all were agreed to have the round-up there.
