

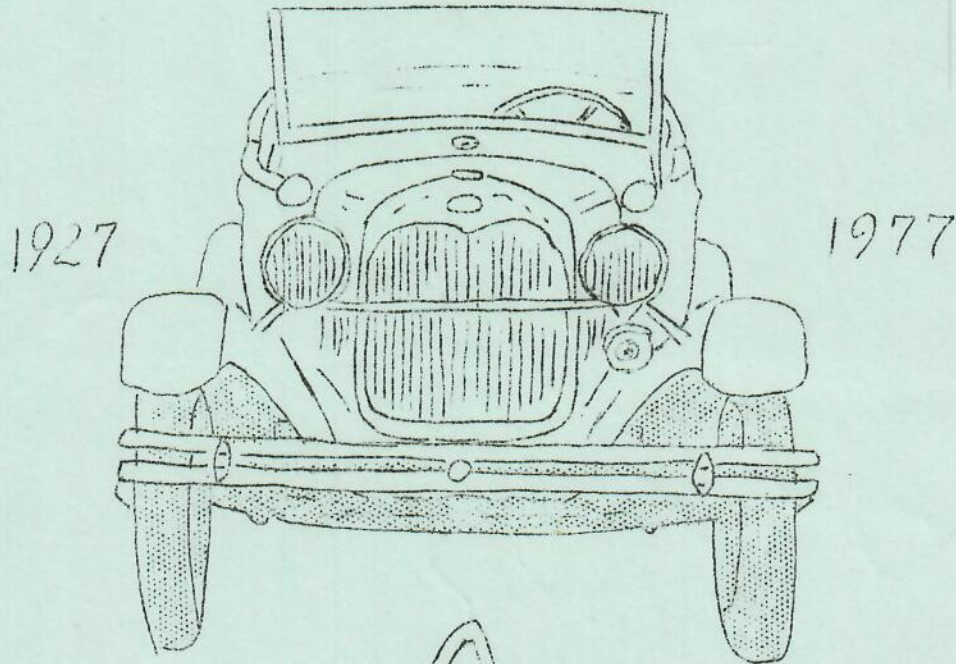

Our first activity of 1977 will be a poker run on Sun. Jan. 23. Starting place will be the Orange Mall. Starting times will begin at 11.00 Am and will be spaced 5 minutes apart. The entry fee will be one new model A part worth less than \$5.00. The best poker hand at the end of the run will get first choice of the parts, second best hand gets second choice and so on down the line. In addition to the model A parts we will also have two \$25. cash prizes. One for the best poker hand and one for the entrant whose time for the run is closest to the average of all the times. For those who have never been on a poker run it is similar to a sports car rally. You follow a page of instructions and a few simple rules to drive a pre planned route.
