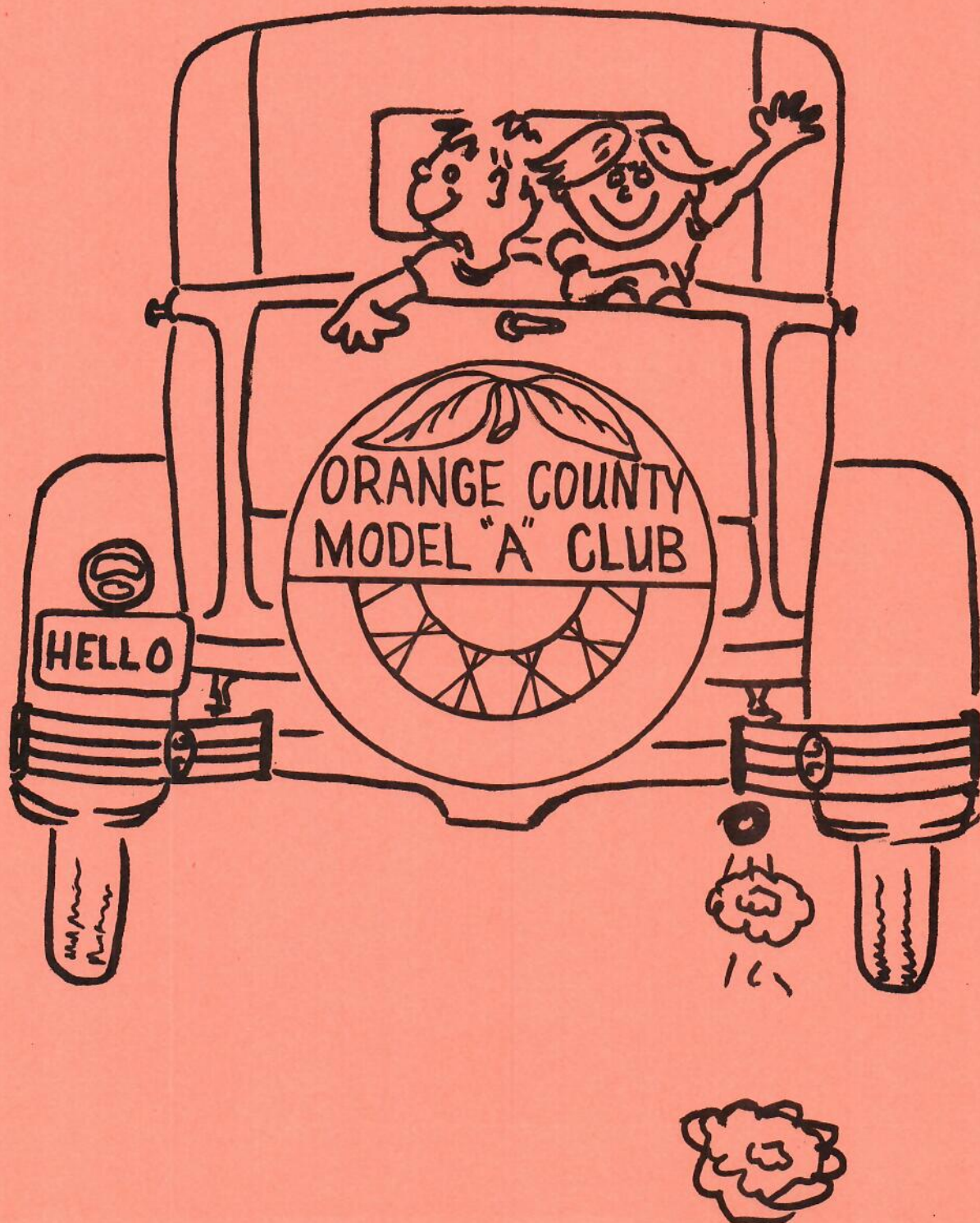

ROUND-UP QUILT

By the time this newsletter is out, I expect to have the last of the quilt squares. There are still 5 squares to be finished and turned in. The 20 squares that I do have are being arranged in the design for placement in the quilt.

I am hoping to have most of the work done on the quilt by the progressive dinner. If you come to our home for the first course you can see all the handiwork!

This may be the last year I can sew the quilt together. If anyone else would like to have this annual project continue, let me know and I'll be glad to give advice on doing the quilt next year. It isn't hard to do, just takes a lot of prodding & reminding, plus definite deadline.

Anyway, thanks to everyone who has done their share this year! We all started working together earlier on our squares. That helps to give me more time to put the quilt together. There will be 25 squares plus 28 pieces of print strips to be sewn into the top. Then the backing & stuffing are put with the top and all of it is quilted on the sewing machine. Then I will put on a binding around the edges to finish the quilt.
