

The chassis wasn't quite ready for the street, but we jacked up the rear end and went through the gears successfully. Now I can go on with the restoration without having that nagging doubt about whether or not the engine and drive train will work. Since the seminar, I haven't done a bit of work on the chassis, but rather I've been driving it up and down the street.

For the February seminar I hope to have Mr. Urb Stair give a talk on "A" carburators. Mr. Stair rebuilds, repairs and exchanges all

types of "A" carburators so grab a couple of your old carbs and come to the seminar. The where abouts and time of the seminar will be given at the meeting.

The technical tip for this month is if your having trouble pulling the head off your engine, just pour about a cup of oil in numbers 1 and 4 cylinders. Screw in the spark plugs and crank the engine over. A little messy, but the force of the compression will pop the head up, therefore, avoiding any damage that may occur, when trying to pry it loose with screwdrivers, etc.
