

TECHNICAL by Kevin Vidal 847-1164

The seminar last month was a very educational one on the simplicity and the complexity of the Model "A" carburator. As a matter of fact, I bought one of Urb Stair's carburators at the latest swap meet and it works great.

For the month of March we just may have two seminars, possibly one on assembling Jim Marsh's front end on his 1928 Phaeton and later on in the month I will be painting my "A" wheels at Matt Plotkins shop so you are all welcome to come. I'llhave the final details at the meeting.

Bingo will be this months after meeting entertainment with cash money prizes.

The technical tip for this month is if you find it very easy to break water outlet goose necks while torqueing down your "A" head, this maybe a possible remedy to the problem. It may sound strange, but get two (2) ordinary wooden match sticks and put one match stick on the outer end, outside the engine stud, in between the head and goose neck ear and start torqueing the head nuts down. The theory behind this is that the match sticks will supposedly displace the torqueing pressure evenly throughout the goose neck, therefore, preventing the ears from

breaking. No, it will not leak. Break off the excess match stick and you're done. I've tried it and it worked for me; so if you have any questions about this trick see me at the meeting.
