

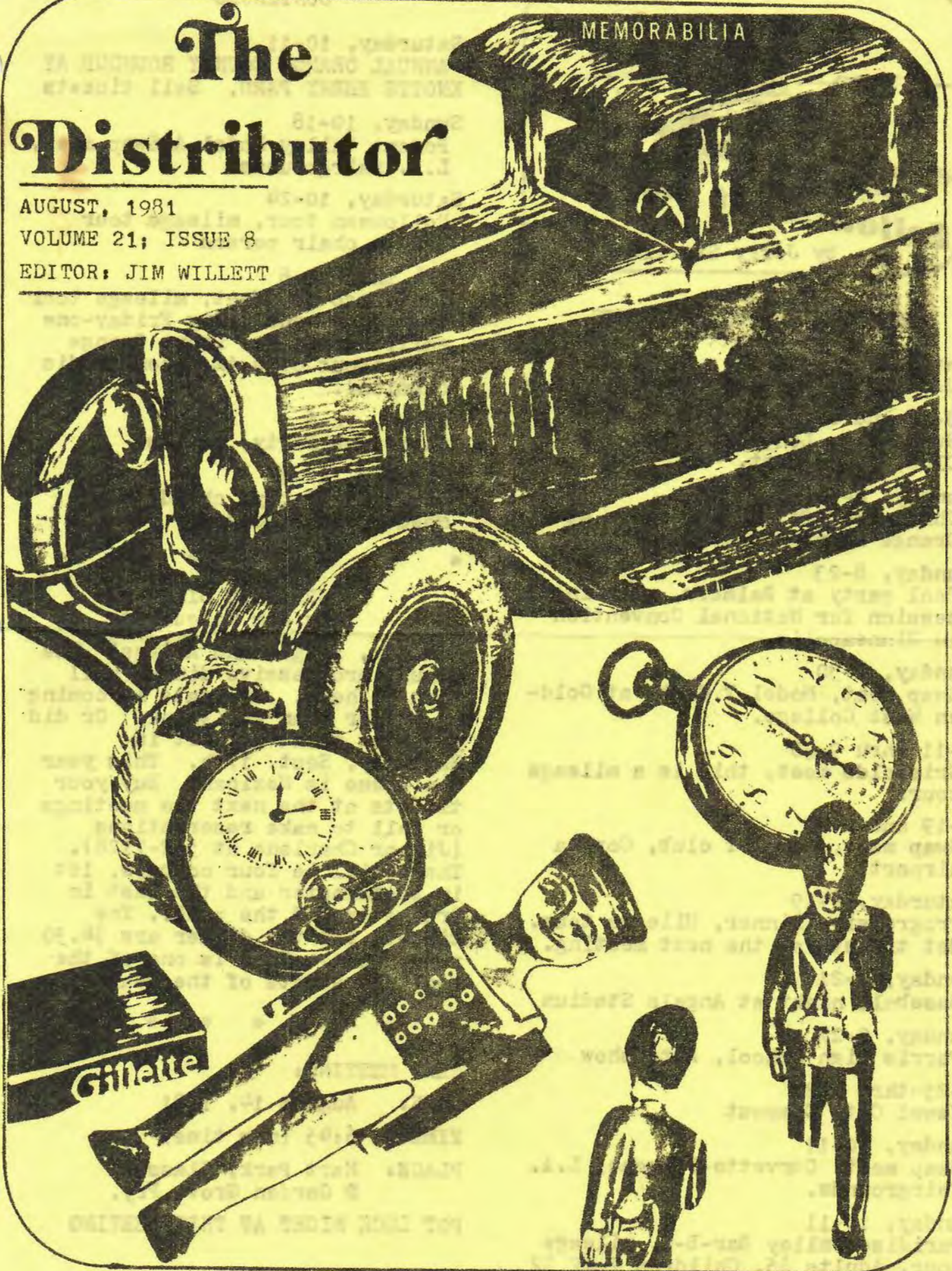

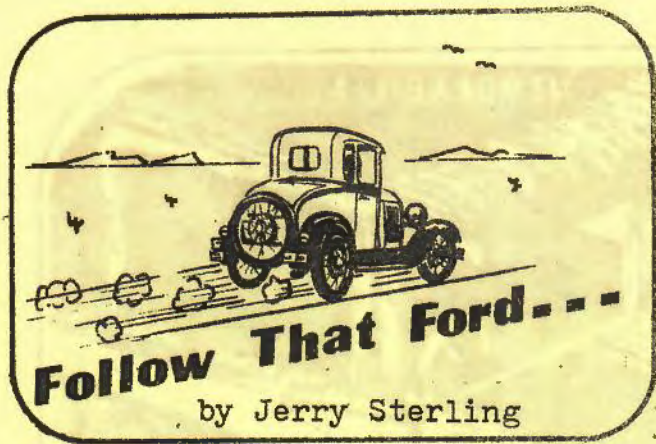

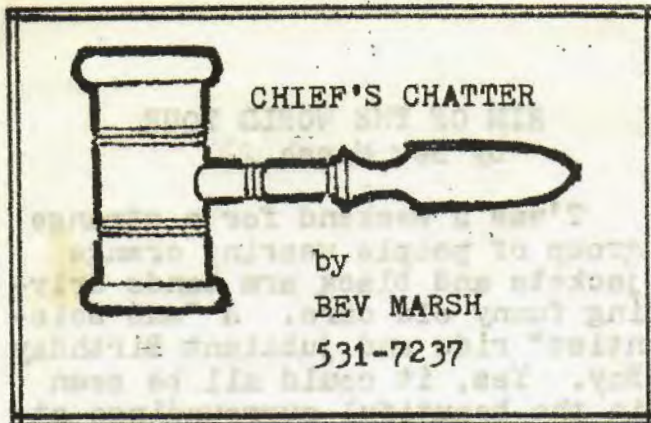
**PROGRESSIVE DINNER**
