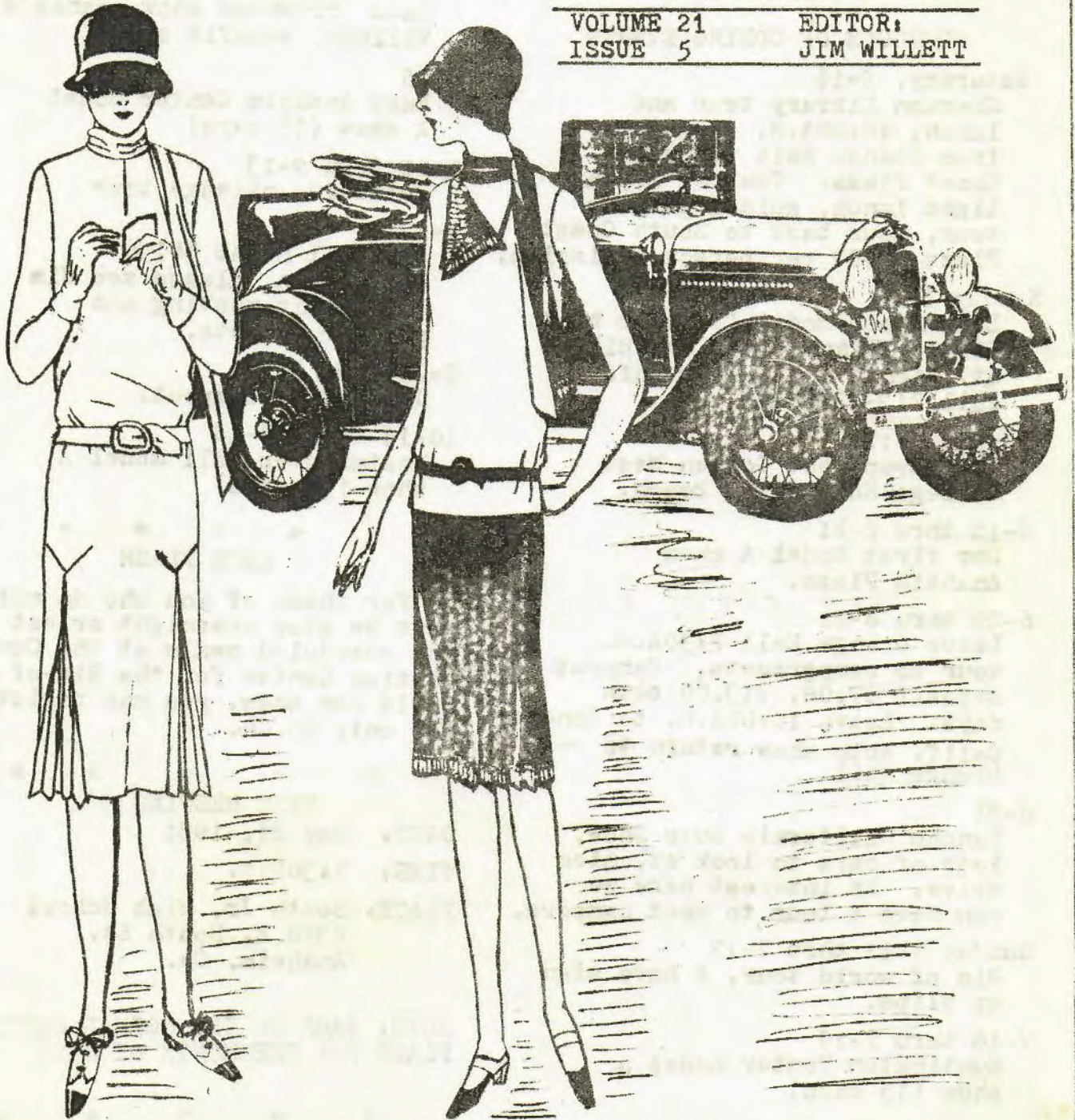

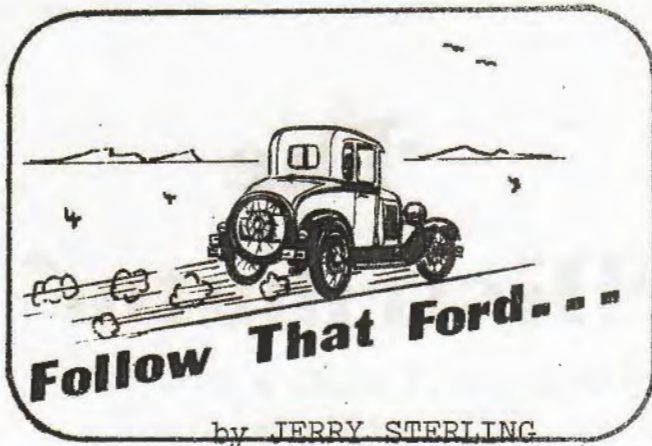

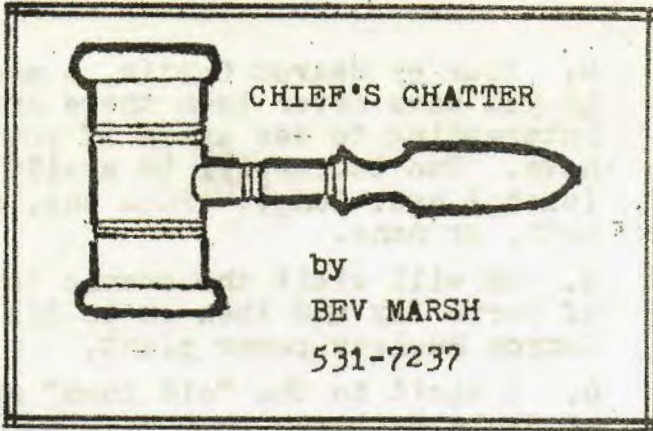

 Sign-up sheets are passed around at the monthly meeting prior to the show. Let's all make these mall show a great success.

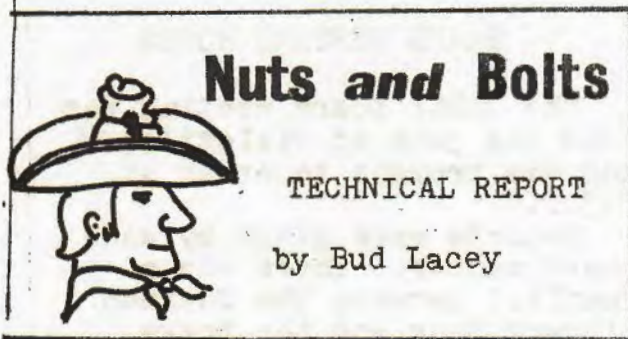

SOLVANG / SAN SIMEON TOUR JUNE 22 through 25th by Matt Plotkin

Plans have been finalized for the 3 night, 4 day tour to Solvang San Luis Obispo, and San Simeon (Hearst Castle). Some of the highlights of the tour are:
