
The next general meeting will be at Hart Park again. Bring your brown bag dinner at 7:00 and the meeting will follow at 7:30.

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FOR THE SHADE TREE MECHANIC

Here's how to replace pan, oil pump, etc., without turning engine and/or car upside down! When engine is in car, just put a screw jack or other device next to the R.H. frame rail and use a long bolt, etc. thru the (1/8 N.P.T.) oil plug hole inside of the block. With the jack exerting force on the bolt keeping the oil pump from falling down, the pan is easily put into place and secured.


