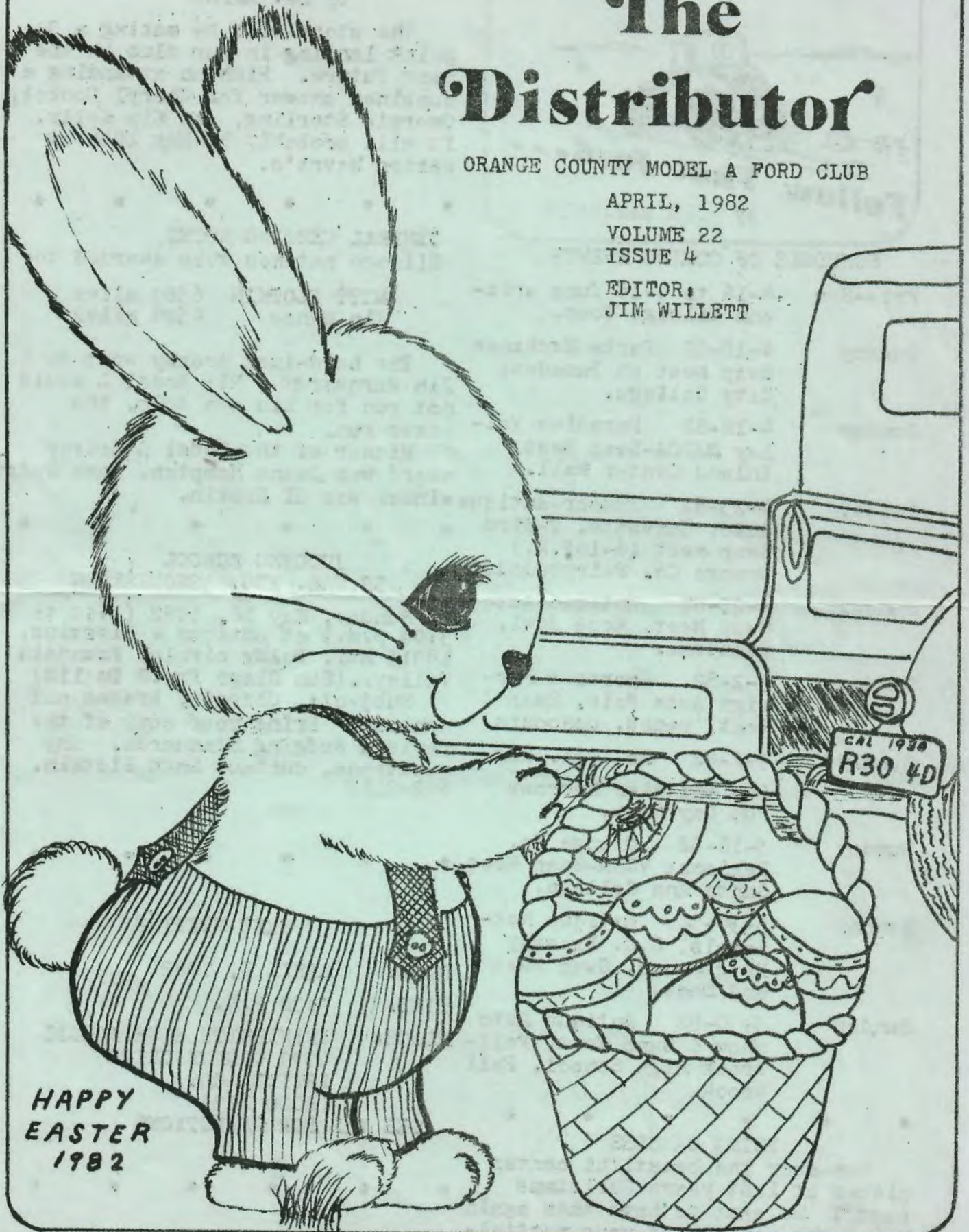

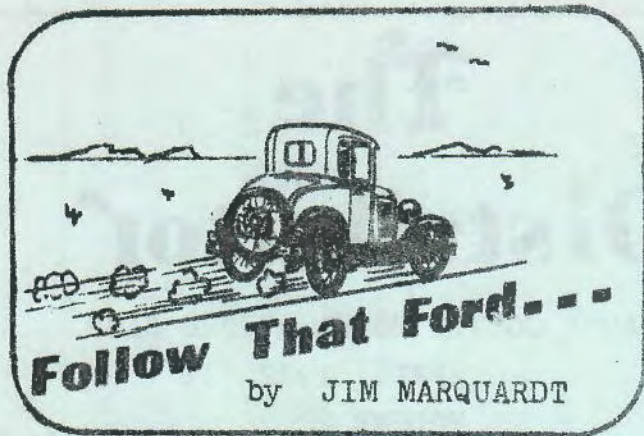

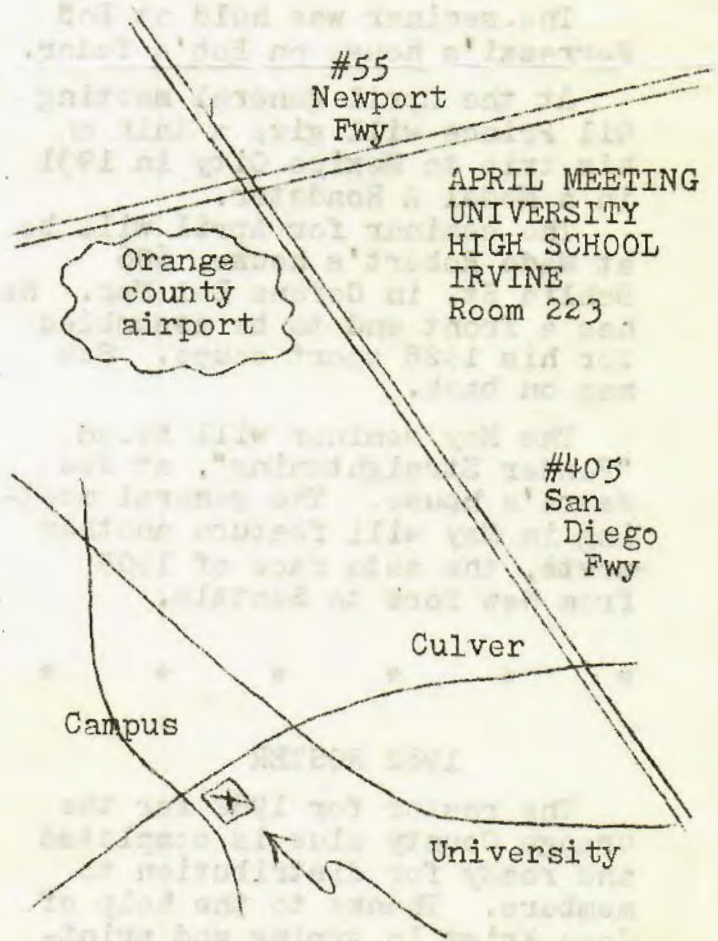

SAVE THAT BODY WOOD

When disassembling the body be sure to mark each piece of wood with it's proper location in the body. The wood parts will need to be reglued. Take out all the screws, blow out the dust and reglue. If there are any wood dowels, replace them. If the screws were rusted out, drill out to 3/8 inch and glue in dowels. Dry rot can be checked by using "Git Rot," found at Marine hardware stores. After inserting the 3/8 inch dowl, drill a small hole in the dowel center to start the screw. Paint the assembly and it will look like new. Don't forget to put felt between the wood and metal pieces to stop squeaks.

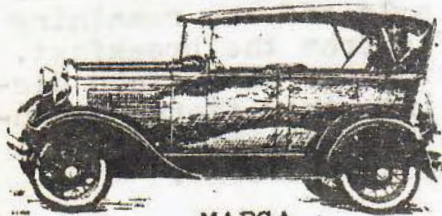
