## BOARD MEETING NOTES



A thank you note was received from the McKinney family for the flowers that were sent by the Model A Club. Gerry's father was killed in an accident in Oregon.


A thank you card was received from Carol Justice for the bouquet she received from the club. Carol is recovering from recent knee surgery.
