TINY TIPS

From the July-August 78 issue of the Restorer.

If a bendix bolt breaks on your starter and drops down to the bottom of the flywheel housing, is it necessary to tear the whole chassis apart to retrieve it?

First, remove the starter and attach a small magnet to a metal rod. Bend to the approximate curvature of the housing.. Guide the magnet and rod through the starter hole and down to the bottom of the housing. With this home made tool and some patience, you'll get the broken part out and won't have to worry about it getting hung up with the flywheel.
