


JUNE GENERAL MEETING


The June general meeting was highlighted by an interesting talk by Gil Prince on his trip to Mexico City in 1930.


Hard luck trophy went to Joe Wavra for this month. Some story about going quail hunting with a garage door. Unfortunately the quail was on his radiator.

We started from Orange Mall for our 175 mile wine tour at 9:05 AM. The tour leader was Larry McKinney. We finally hit the freeway and our caravan looked as though it was 5 miles long, heading South for the wine country near Rancho Calif.

A few miles from the mall a whole string of Model A's pulled off the freeway to the shoulder (which is illegal guys, READ your tour rules). After much maneuvering, rubber-necking, and waiting we finally started merging back onto the freeway. As we were nearing Lake Elsinore Ray Griffin in his beautiful 31 Town Sedan had engine problems.

GERRY'S SAUSAGE

This is a recipe for the sausage as sampled by the participants in the wine tour. Taken from the recipe book of Clem and Dorothy Maggenberg; Arcadia, Iowa.

- 2 lbs cheap ground beef teaspoon: Onion powder garlic powder mustard seed
- 1 teaspoon; cracked pepper 1 tablespoon brown sugar
- 2 tablespoon curring salt
- l tablespoon liquid smoke Mix thoroughly

Form into 2 rolls and wrap in foil. Refrigerate for 24 hrs. Place on cookie sheet and bake @ 350 degrees for 1 hour (bake in foil). Unwrap-roll in paper towel to soak up grease and wrap in fresh foil. Refrigerate for 24 hours.
