



A tip; when grinding the valves on a Model A, much time can be saved if a light compression spring is slipped over the valve stem and the valve quide is installed upside down. Then a rubber band slipped around the guide will hold it together so that the entire assembly can be pulled out when removing the valve to check the grinding job. The spring will tend to force the guide in position when replacing the assembly for further grinding.


