




Lou's Monthly Hint:

When a zerk fitting becomes nicked or slightly damaged in any way, it is almost impossible to grease the part with a lubegun as the lubricant squeezes out around the nick when pressure is applied. As an emergency repair, I have found that a piece of cloth placed over the end of the gun serves nicely. The cloth is stretched tightly and is punctured by the end of the fitting, thus allowing the grease to pass but effectively sealing the nick in the fitting.


BOARD MEETING NOTES
