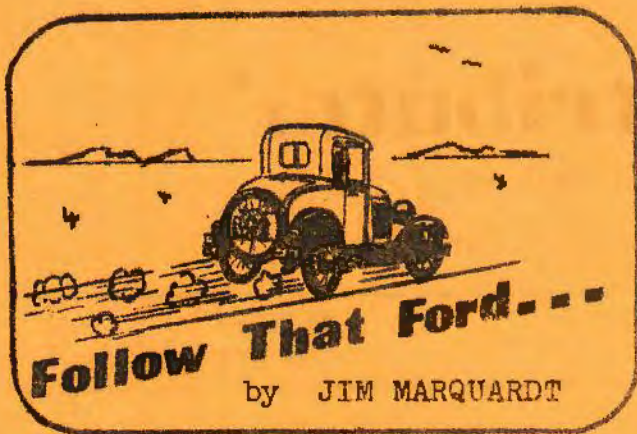

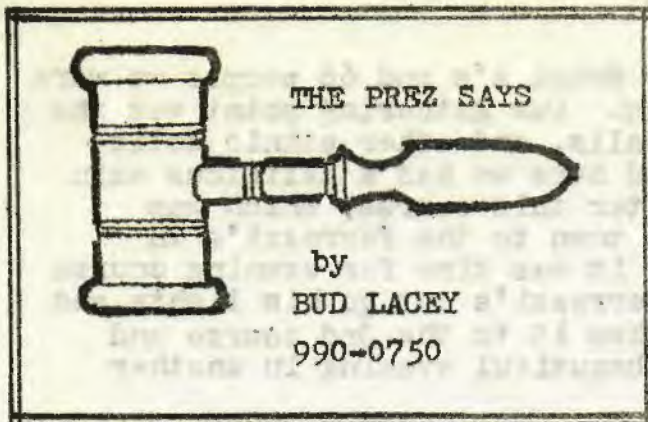
EDITORIAL OPPORTUNITY

IT'S HOME COMING TIME

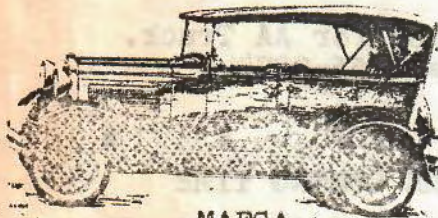
