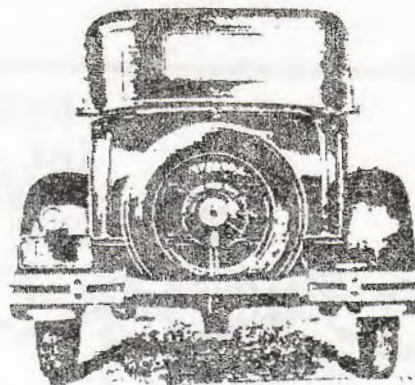

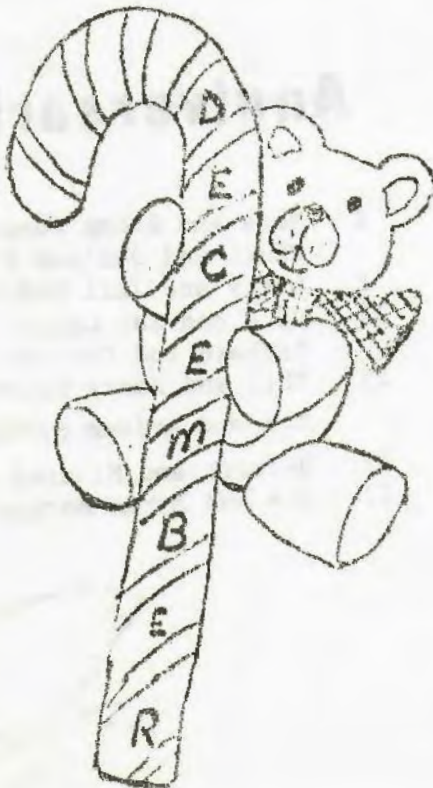
2. Approved a Sunday, November 20 tour to Oceanside. Departure from South Coast Plaza at 7:00 A.M.

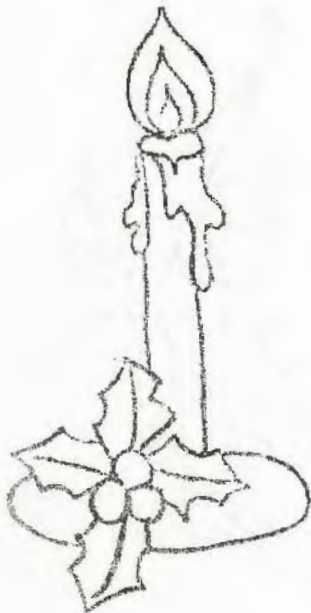

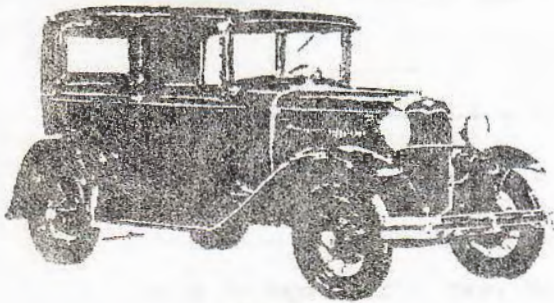
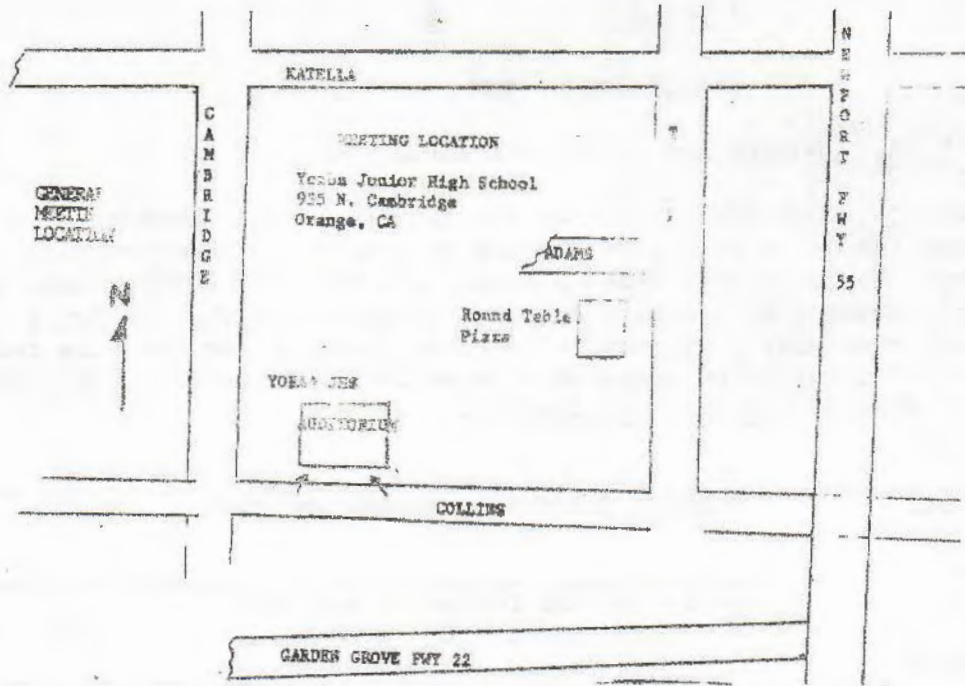
