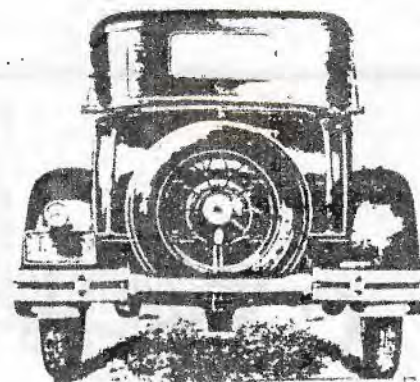
Goody bag donations are starting to come in, but we need much more!! Plan on bringing yours in by the September meeting.

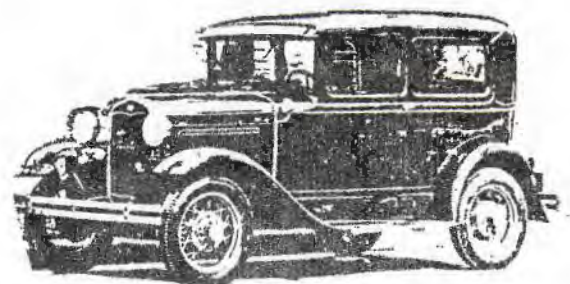

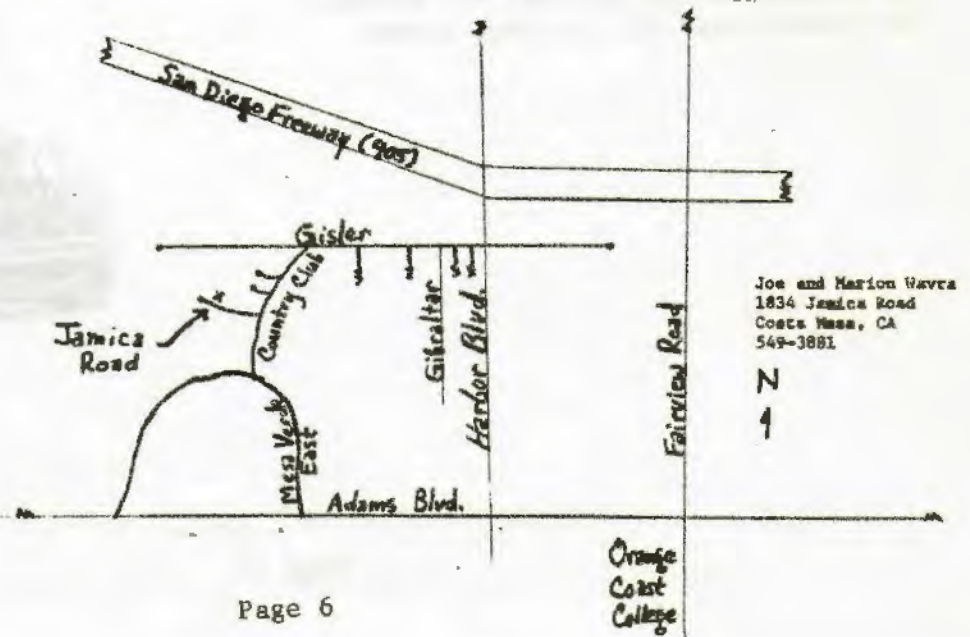
7 LAYER DIP

8 oz. grated cheddar cheese
2 tomatoes, chopped small
2 cans chopped olives

Marion's Technical Seminar Special

1 lg. and 1 sm. pkg. cream cheese
6 T sugar
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. vanilla
2 eggs
Mix the above ingredients until smooth. Pour into crumb crust (lg. 9"). Bake 15 min. Cool 10 min.
Mix $\frac{1}{2}$ pt. sour cream with 6 T sugar and $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. vanilla. Spoon over the top of the first mixture. Bake 10 min. Cool. Chill. Set oven at 350°F.

September 17, 1983

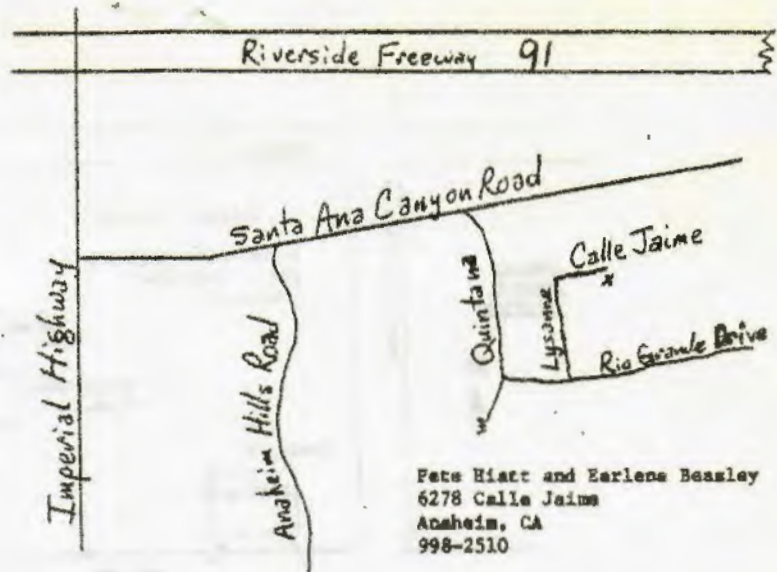
The Annual Progressive Dinner will be held Saturday, September 17, 1983, starting at 5:30 P.M.

Hors d'oeuvres will be hosted by Earlene Beazley and Pete Hiatt at their Anaheim Hills home.

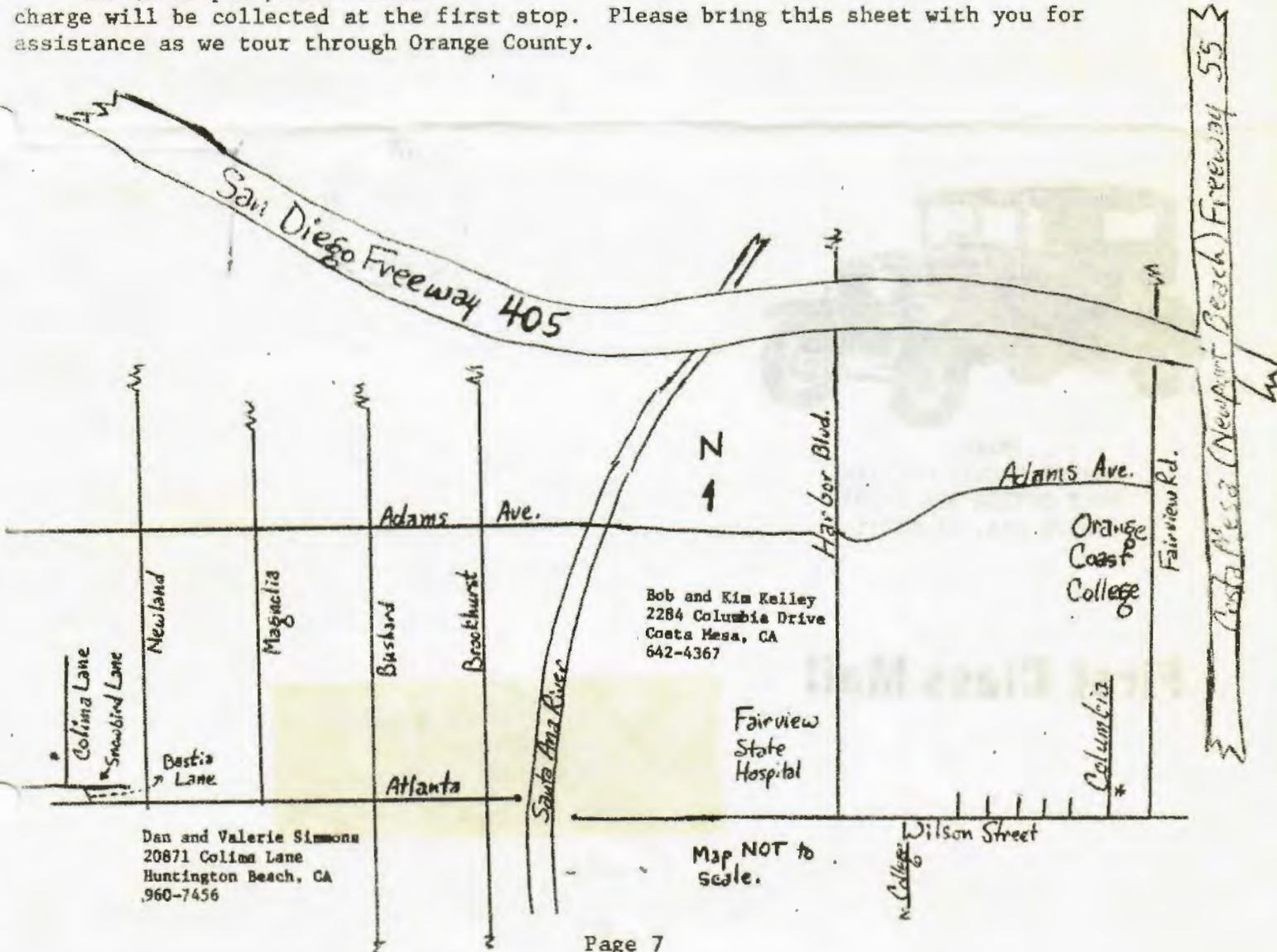
The main course will consist of barbecued roast beef and ham and will be at the Simmons' home. The Lanes are assisting.

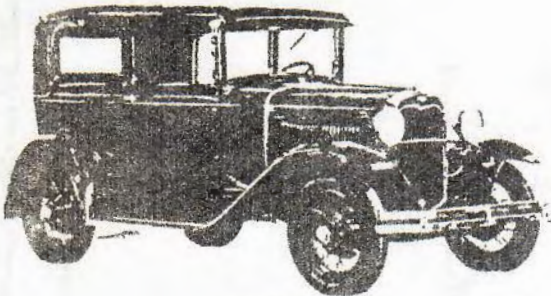
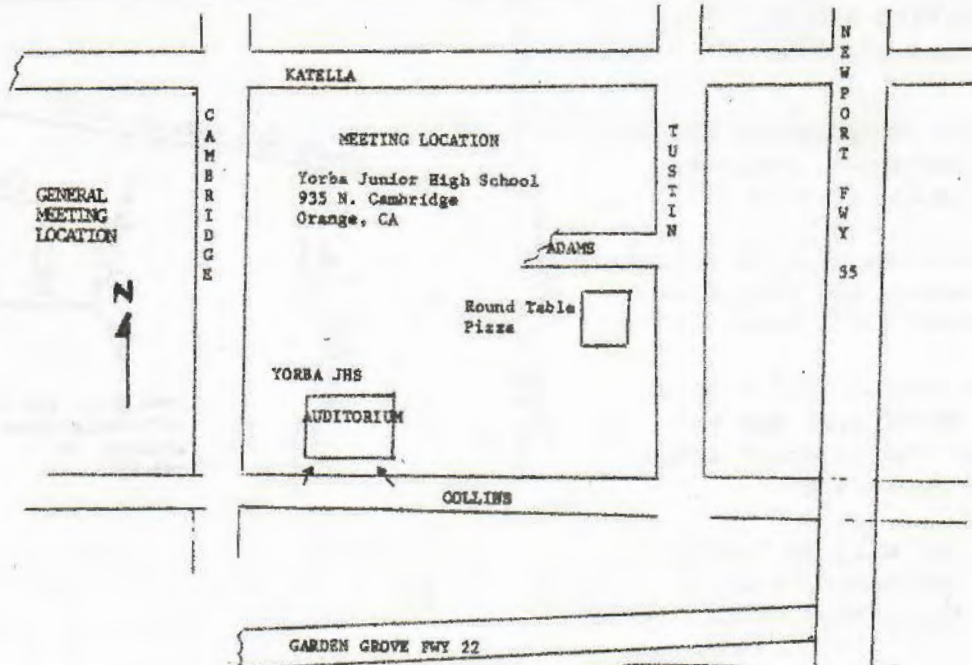
The dessert will be hosted by the Bob Kelleys and Rihas at the Kelley's Costa Mesa home.

The \$5.00 per person dinner charge will be collected at the first stop. Please bring this sheet with you for assistance as we tour through Orange County.

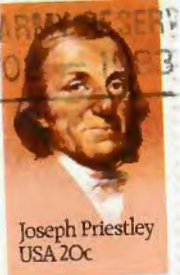
