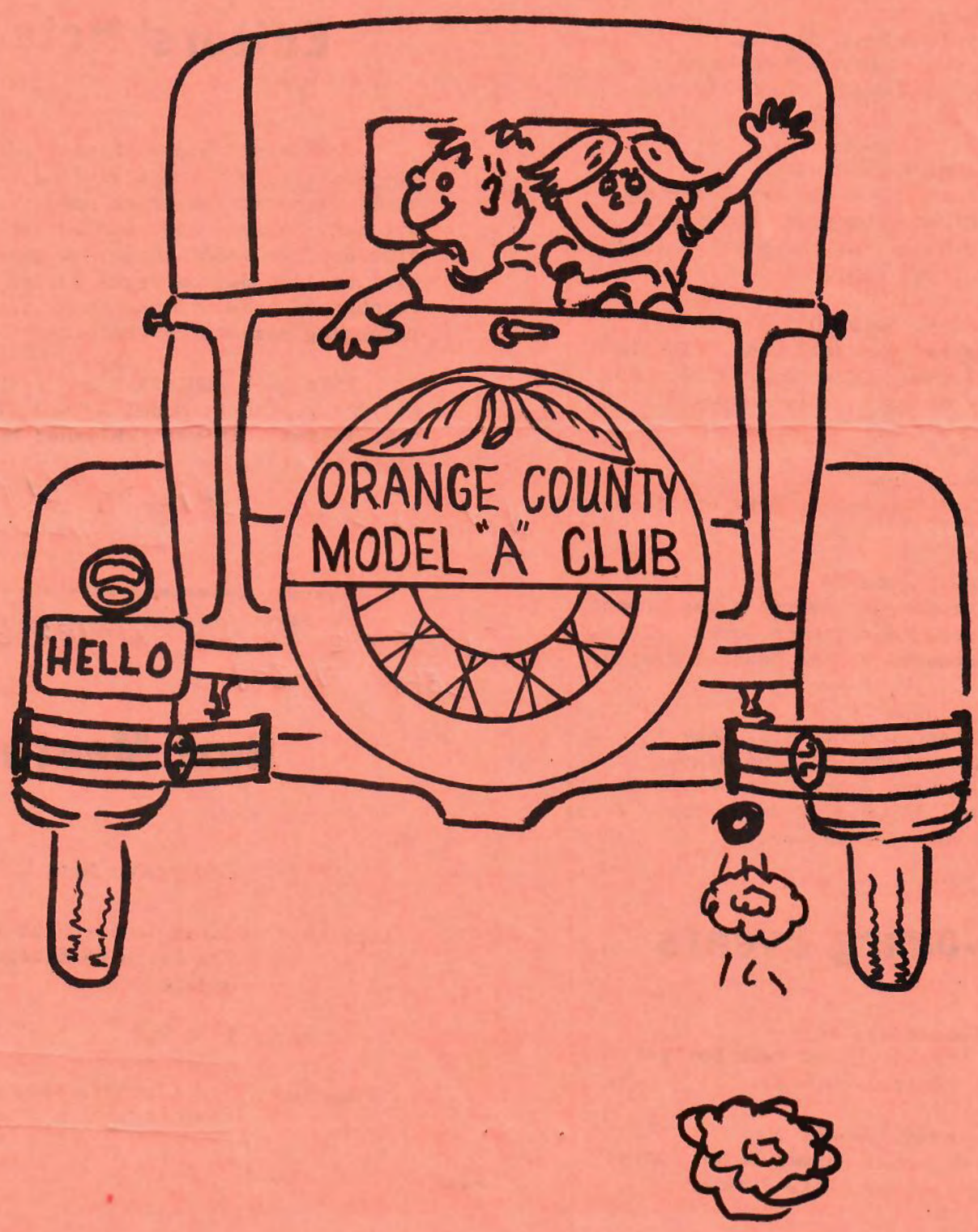

A thank you note was received from the Hank Sorney family thanking the club for the flowers. Hank's Mother recently passed away. We send our condolences to the Sorney family.

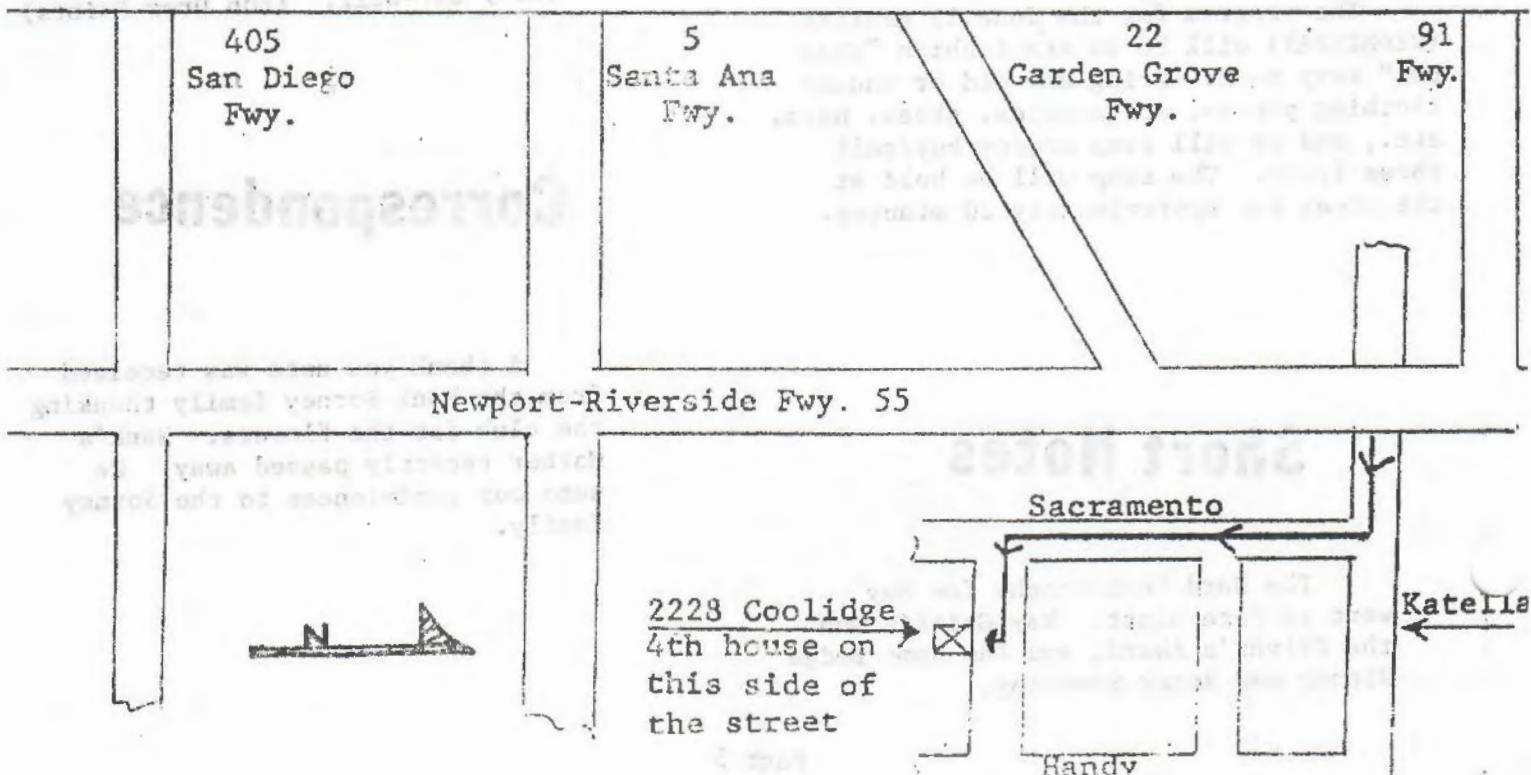
