If you have friends-relatives-neighbors who like old cars--good tours--great friends--and good food, how about inviting them to our next business meeting and/or tour.

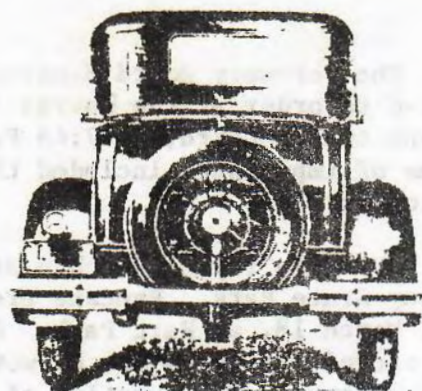
Board Meeting Notes
