

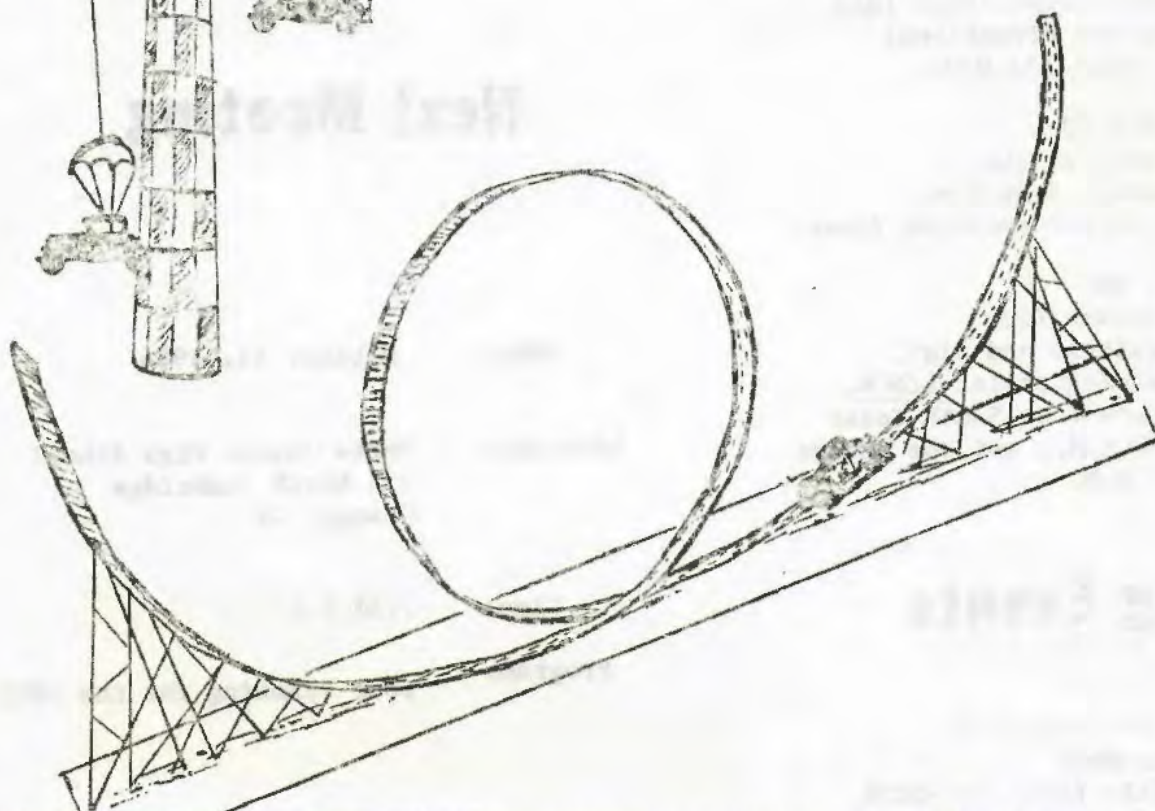
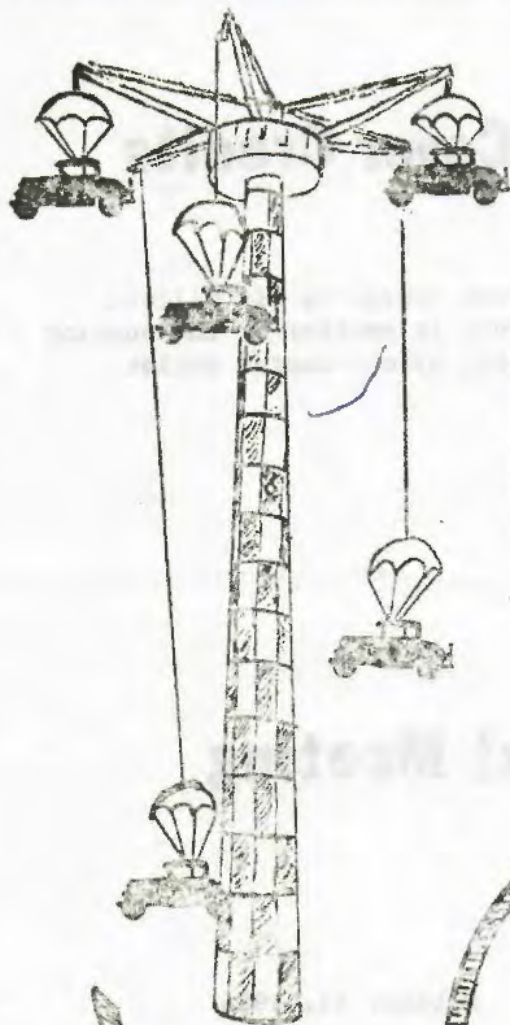

Goodie bag stuff is due by October 11 (the next regular meeting). Any goodies turned in, should be given to Chuck Stinnett at the general meeting.

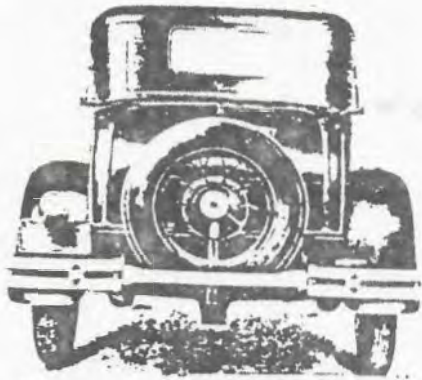
I would like to remind all of the "Modified" rules for this year's Roundup. They are as follows:

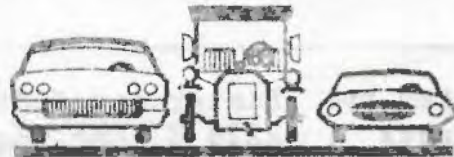

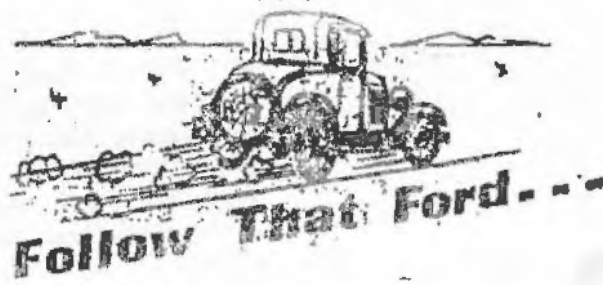

Vince Mariola won the Hard Luck Trophy for September. The Driver Award went to Steve Balmer, and Duane Robinson was the Name Badge Winner.

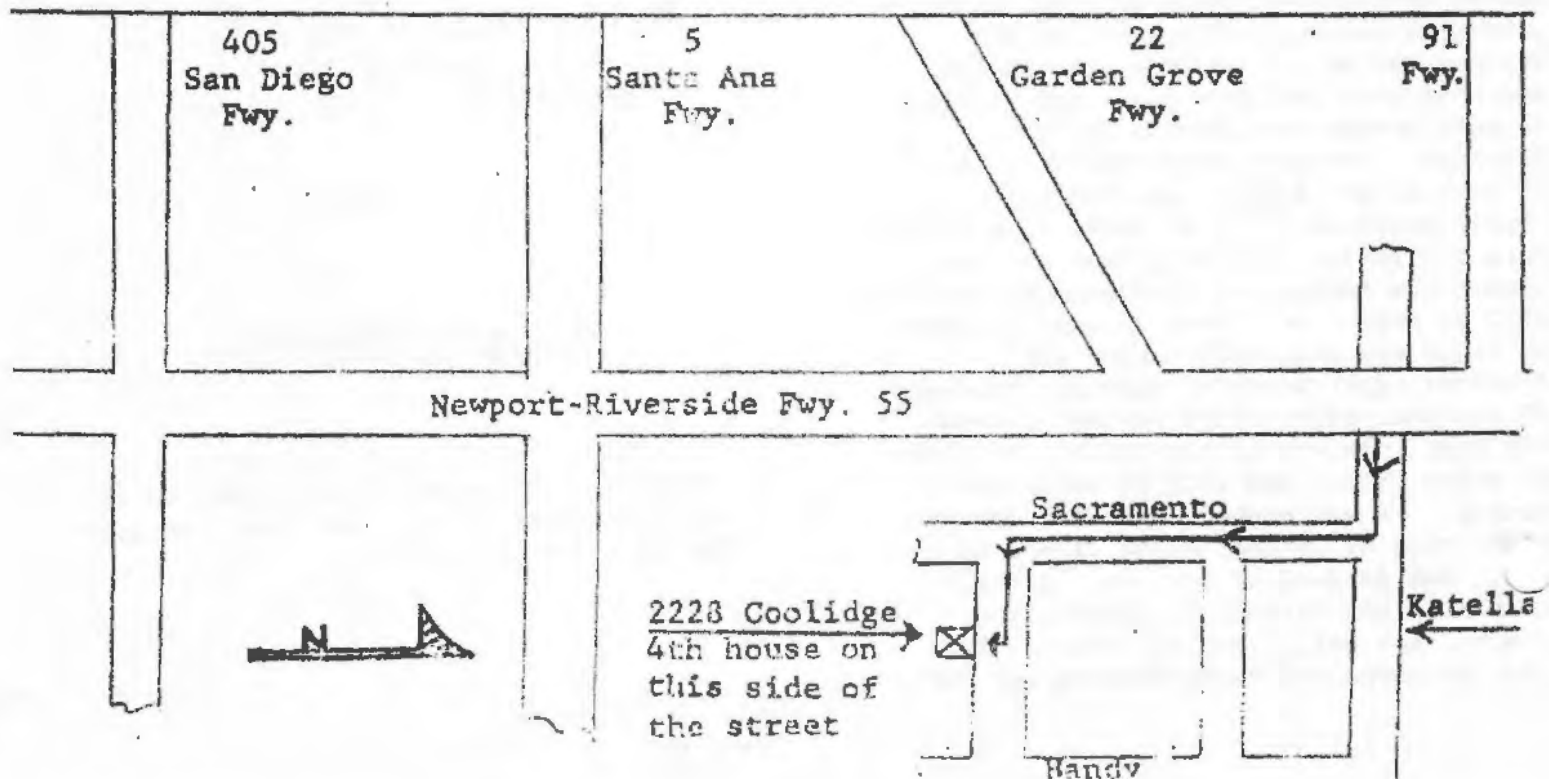

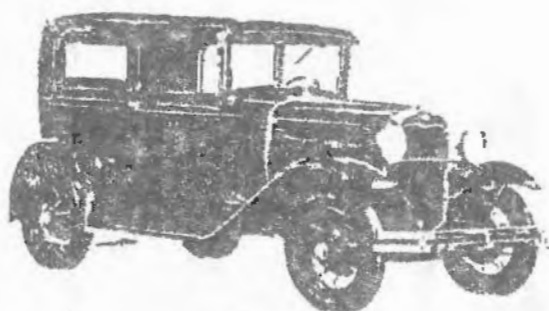
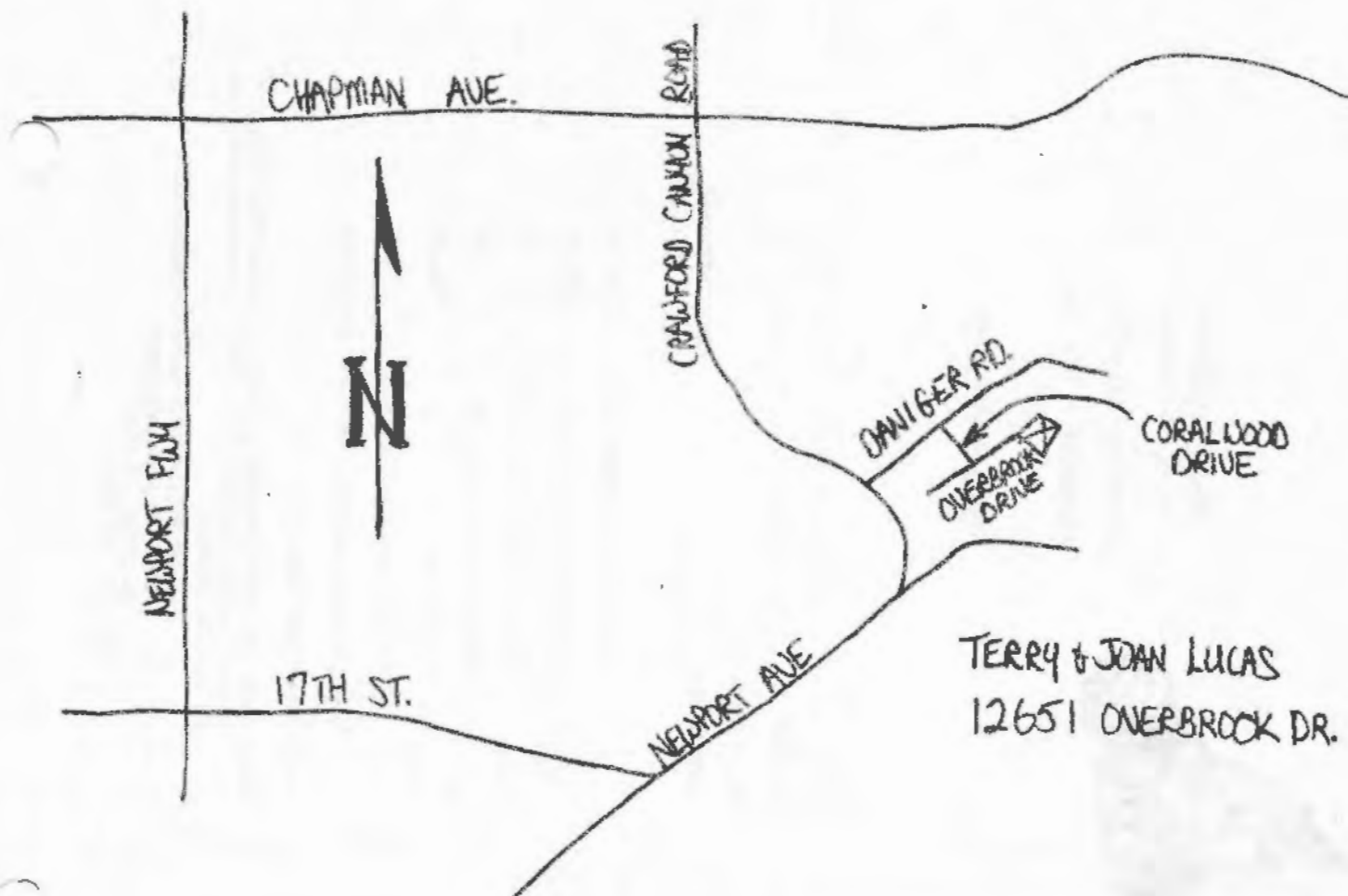
