
MARCH MEETING

Distributor Editors reported that the Roster is out and additions and corrections will be added from time to time.


Dick Riha reported that 24 men and 6 ladies attended the March seminar. (See his article.) There will not be a seminar in April. Work on the trailer is not yet completed.

ROUNDUP REPORT by Jerry Sterling



TECHNICAL TALK by Dick Riha

The seminar on teflon steering inserts and diodes for cut-outs was attended by 24 men and 6 ladies. We had no problem getting rid of 24 sets of teflon steering inserts. We also talked 10 members into buying 12 diodes. We started the evening with Dennis Griffin giving an excellent talk on how to identify an original cut-out, and how to tell the difference between reproduction and original drag links and Pitman arms. I would also like to thank Dennis for making the radius tool to cut the teflon inserts.

The evening continued with the making of the inserts. We made one-third of ten sets, which showed everyone just how they are produced and how much work it takes to build a set. I promised to build the remaining sets and hand them out at the April meeting, but that will not be possible since the engine in my '3i Sedan gave up and must be rebuilt before the Yuma tour. I will get them completed in time for the May meeting. Some members converted cut-outs or watched it done, so they can do it at home.

The April general meeting will not have a special program since a good number of members will be representing Drange County in Yuma. We will also hold the technical seminar in Yuma, or somewhere on the road between here and there!

The May meeting will be a white elephant auction, so bring all items you want to get rid of; this means anything (excluding kids, wives, and husbands). Proceeds will go to the club.

The May seminar will be a Saturday event: a safety check of members' Model A's, held at my house.


A COMMENTARY by Keith and Carol Justice

For over 20 years this club has been inviting members of southern California Model A clubs to join us for our annual Pancake Breakfast. I gather from what I read in the old copies of the distributor that the event was considered primarily a fund-raiser in the early years, and we still see it as a welcome source of revenue to help support our "loss leaders" such as the Roundup. But we believe it has taken on a significance beyond those early expectations. This year we had approximatey 125 Model A's in attendance from 8 clubs, including Anaheim Hot Rods, Diamond Tread, Jewel City, Paradise Valley, Pomona Valley, Queen Mary, San Fernando Valley, Whittier. Even the Roundup doesn't draw as many cars as this event. Apparently, a lot of people see this tour as the first chance to get their car out after the relative inactivity of the winter season. We think it is one of the most enjoyable functions of the year, because of the sheer number of cars we get to see.

This year we again had the long lines of (outwardly) patient people waiting to be served. Plans have already been made to increase the number of orills from 3 to 5 for next year! With the increasing attendance at this event, we believe some consideration should be given to organizing some aditional activities for the morning. The afternoon Gymkhana was discontinued because few people wanted to stay around that long and get themselves to another location where it could be held. (Several clubs go the the beach for kite flying after breakfast. Maybe we should join them.) But it seems to us that there is slack time in the morning which could be used for erjoyable and/or beneficial activities. One way to come up with viable possibilities is to ask the other clubs for ideas. Most of these clubs will be at Whittier Narrows. Perhaps someone from our club (Jon or Pieter?) could get a group from the other clubs together for an informal discussion.




