

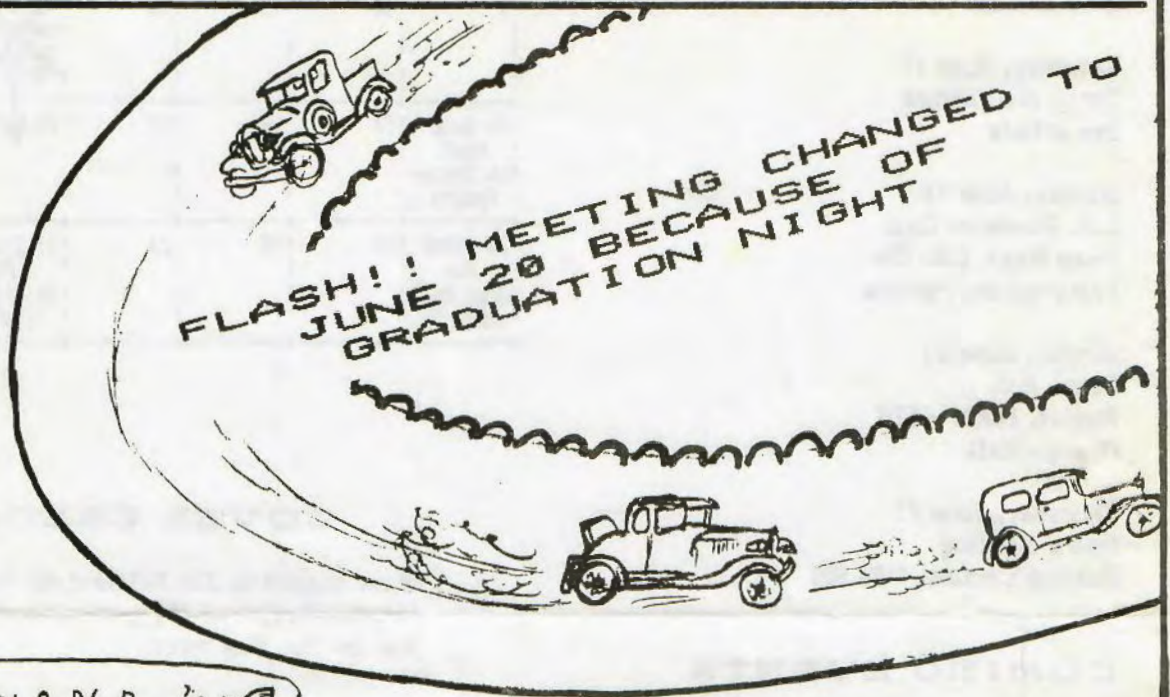

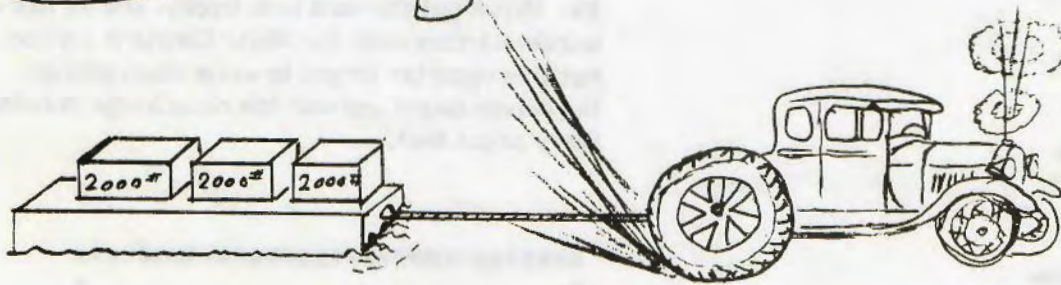

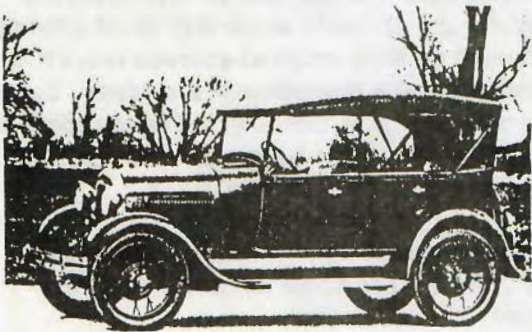

I am scheduled to make a presentation at the Whittier club on June 4 to drum up further support.

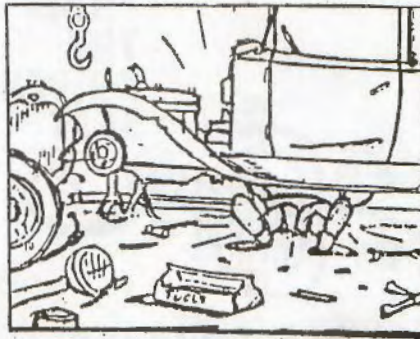

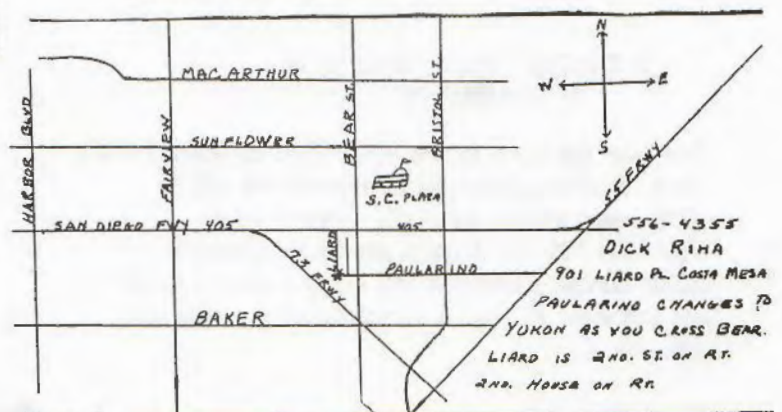

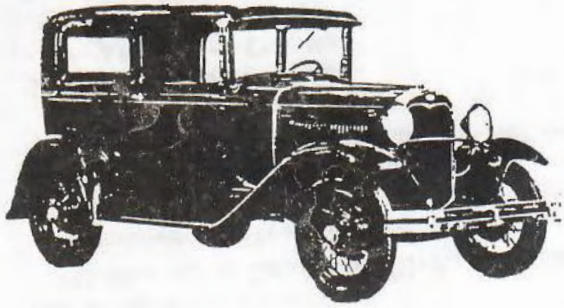
