

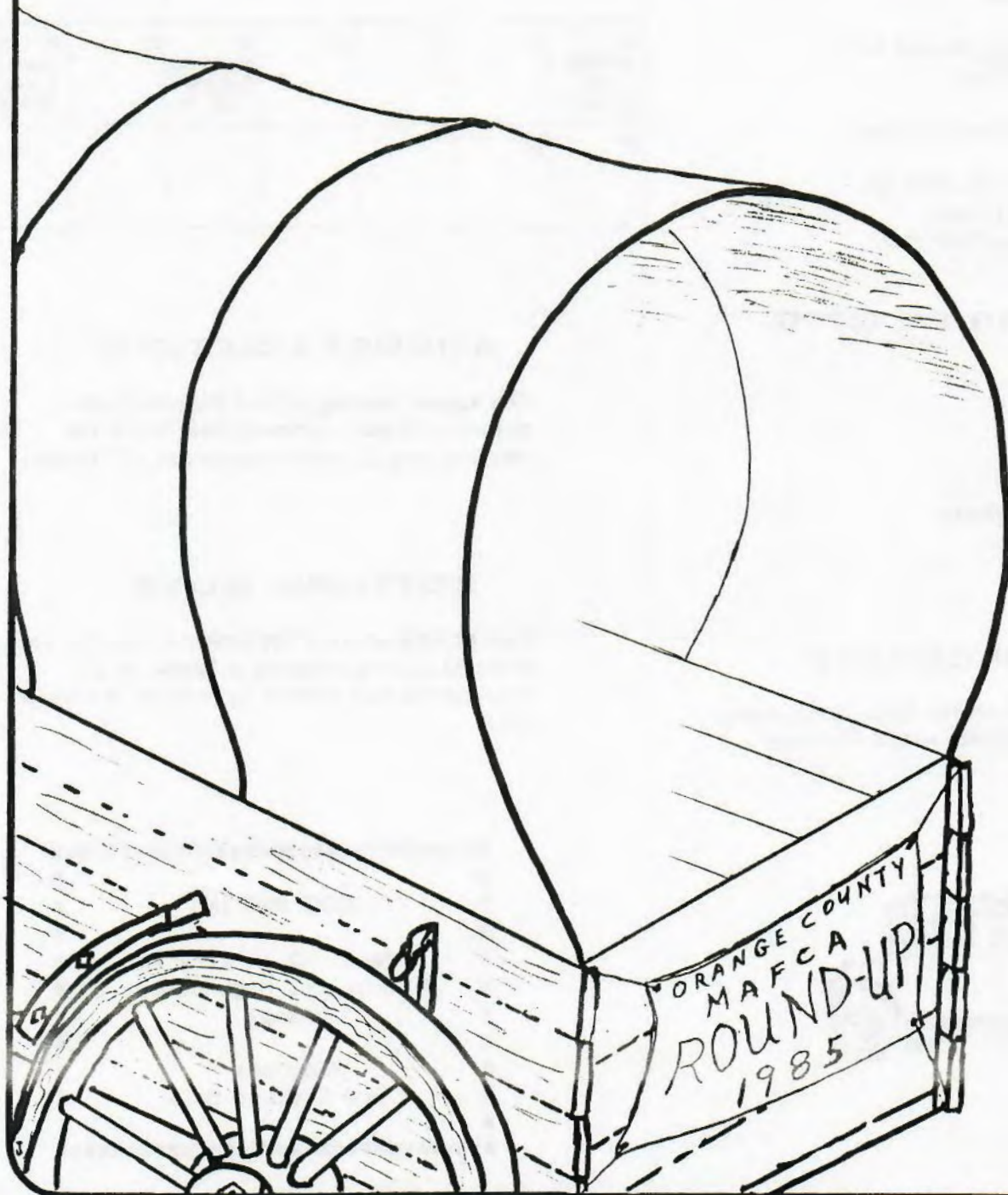

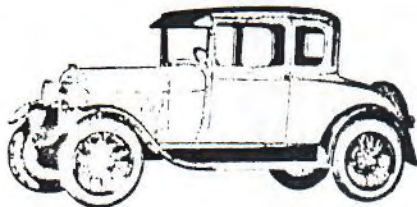

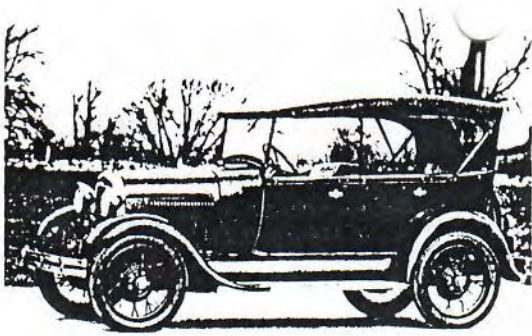
Distributor report: The Justices are on vacation. The September Distributor will be a little late.

The 10 days the club spent on tour were so filled with neat things that I know I can't relate them all, so I'll just tell you of a few.

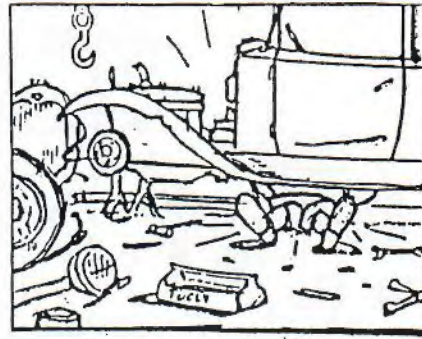

Who could help but have a wonderful time?



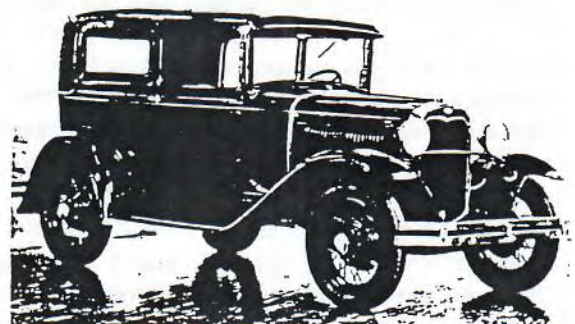
TECHNICAL TALK
